CIVIL AVIATION

MAY, 1941.

Passenger travel by air increased to 17,531 passengers carried in May as against 13,057 in April and the passenger miles flown increased from 4,569,808 in April to 4,850,873. Revenue freight carried declined from 916,437 pounds to 914,468 pounds and the ton miles declined from 63,858 to 60,882. Pounds of mail carried by air increased from 245,265 to 274,748 and the mail ton miles from 65,699 to 71,532.

Time flown by aircraft in all civil services increased from 8,985 to 9,235 hours and the gasoline consumption increased from 363,853 to 376,833 gallons. For international operators only the fuel purchased in Canada is included.

Revenues of Canadian companies increased from \$651,065 in April to \$704,705 and operating expenses were reduced from \$694,259 to \$624,474,converting the debit of \$43,174 in April to a credit net operating revenue of \$80,251 for May.
