CIVIL AVIATION

JULY, 1941.

Passenger traffic by air for July increased to 19,087 revenue passengers carried as against 17,551 in June and 15,061 in May. Revenue freight showed a slight decrease, which however was more than offset by an increase in non revenue freight, and the total increased to 2,045,032 lbs. as against 1,981,618 lbs. in June. Mail increased from 254,898 lbs. in June to 257,730 lbs. Total aircraft hours flown in all classes of service amounted to 11,884 hours compared with 10,662 hours in June.

Operating revenues of Canadian companies operating over licensed routes were \$836,104, operating expenses were \$721,783 and net operating revenues were \$114,321 as against \$806,224, \$707,547 and \$98,677 respectively for June.
