SUMMARY OF MONTHLY REPORTS

1941

In this summary of the monthly reports of air carriers some revisions have been made, largely in connection with non revenue transportation service in both 1940 and 1941 data. Data for 1940 were taken from the quarterly reports. This report also include accident data for only the air carriers reporting monthly, which were supplied by the Director of Air Services of the Department of Transport. These data do not include any for training schools, flying clubs or operators engaged principally in sightseeing flying.

The revenue aircraft miles flown in transportation service during 1941 amounted to 11,800,661, an increase of 15.1 p.c. over 1940. The number of revenue passengers carried increased from 137,690 in 1940 to 193,097 or by 40.2 p.c., and the revenue freight carried increased from 12,899,998 to 14,804,681 lbs. or by 14.8 p.c. Mail carried increased from 2,737,122 to 3,388,634 lbs. or 23.8 p.c. The average revenue passenger journey remained at 279 miles and the revenue passenger miles increased 40.2 p.c. Revenue freight ton miles showed an increase of 24.4 p.c.

During the year these air carriers had accidents in which 19 persons were killed and 5 were injured, as compared with 5 killed and 8 injured in 1940. The chief factor in this increase was one accident in which the crew of 3 persons and 9 passengers were killed. On a passenger mileage basis the averages were 1.94 passengers killed and 0.88 passengers injured per 10 million passenger miles flown, as compared with averages of 0.97 killed and 1.22 injured in 1940.

The average speed of aircraft for licensed air carriers in revenue transportation service increased from 128 to 132 miles per hour. International operators showed an increase from 144 to 152 miles per hour. The average number of revenue passengers per aircraft mile for all carriers increased from 3.7 to 4.6 and revenue freight carried per aircraft mile increased from 150 to 162 lbs. Gasoline consumption for Canadian operators increased from 3,648,199 gallons to 4,189,916 gallons, and the average per aircraft hour flown increased from 38.2 to 40.5 gallons. Data reported for international flights include only fuel purchased in Canada and consequently averages for these flights can not be computed.
