## MAY, 1942.



Air carriers operating in Canada carried 20,810 revenue passengers during May as compared with 15,311 in May last year, and the average journey was 296 miles as against 301 miles in 1941. Freight carried dropped to 743,936 lbs. from 915,353 lbs. and mail increased to 374,176 lbs. from 274,748 lbs.

Gasoline consumption amounted to 419,706 gallons as against 376,833 gallons in May, 1941. The average consumption per 1,000 h.p. hours dropped from 40.9 to 40.5 gallons, but due to larger aircraft and higher speeds the average consumption per aircraft hour has increased from 41.4 to 46.5 gallons.

Revenues of Canadian licensed operators increased from \$704,705 to \$903,197 and operating expenses increased from \$624,474 to \$819,517. The number of employees increased from 1,604 to 1,941 and the pay roll rose from \$244,098 to \$326,232.
