

CIVIL AVIATION
AUGUST, 1942

Revenue passengers carried by civil air carriers for August amounted to 20,502 as compared with 20,162 for July and 20,100 for August last year. Revenue freight carried by aircraft increased to 1,145,217 lbs. from 1,119,721 lbs. for July, but was below the August 1941 traffic. Mail amounted to 416,408 lbs. as compared with 378,293 lbs. in July and 282,615 lbs. in August last year.

Hours flown and miles flown by aircraft in transportation service declined from July, and gasoline consumed, including only that purchased in Canada by the international operators, decreased from 485,484 gallons in July to 426,990 gallons.

The number of employees of Canadian companies increased to 2,230 and the pay roll to \$392,502 as compared with 1,718 and \$283,298 for August 1941, and operating revenues increased to \$1,129,864 from \$1,082,437 in July and \$822,536 in August last year.

For Canadian licensed companies the average aircraft speed increased from 138 miles per hour in July to 140, and the average number of passengers per aircraft increased from 5.1 in July to 6.1. Their consumption of gasoline per horse power hour decreased by 3 p.c., but the average per aircraft hour increased by 7.5 p.c.
