SUMMARY OF MONTHLY REPORTS

1942

Revenue passengers travelling by air in 1942 increased to 214,691 from 193,097 in 1941 and total passengers, including also non-revenue passengers and company employees increased to 228,193 from 208,076, or by 9.7 per cent. Because of longer average journeys total passenger miles increased by 29.5 per cent, and passenger hours flown by 25.0 per cent. Revenue freight carried decreased from 14,804,681 lbs. in 1941 to 11,454,570 lbs., but ton miles increased by 18.4 per cent. mail increased both in volume and in ton miles, the volume increasing from 3,388,634 to 5,258,071 lbs., or by 55.2 per cent, and ton miles increasing by 67.6 per cent. Employees of Canadian companies increased from 1,669 to 2,092, and the pay rolls increased from \$3,094,146 to \$4,303,569. Revenues of Canadian companies operating over licensed routes increased from \$8,826,515 to \$11,751,964; operating expenses increased from \$8,310,272 to \$11,092,807, and net operating revenues increased from \$516,243 to \$659,157.

The number of persons killed in aircraft accidents of licensed Canadian companies was reduced from 9 in 1941 to 3 in 1942, and the number injured was reduced from 5 to 4. Due to increases in crew and passenger hours and miles flown, the averages on hours and miles bases showed still greater improvement. No accidents occurred with the unlicensed and international operators making monthly reports. In addition to these there were 5 pilots killed and 4 pilots and 4 passengers injured in private, training, and other flying. These were excluded from the tables because the operators were not required to make monthly reports, and consequently their miles flown, hours flown, etc. were not included in this report.

The average speed of all aircraft included in the statistics increased from 150 miles per hour in 1941 to 157 miles per hour, and the number of revenue passengers per aircraft mile increased from 4.6 to 5.5 or by 19.5 per cent. The average horse power per aircraft of the Canadian licensed companies, weighted by hours flown, shows an increase of 14.4 per cent. This accounts for the greater consumption of gasoline per aircraft hour, although on a horse power hour basis it was reduced by 2.7 per cent.
