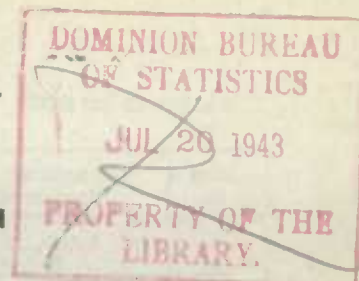

CIVIL AVIATION

MARCH, 1943

Revenue passengers carried by air carriers numbered 22,054 for March, which was only slightly below the record reached in June, 1942. The increase over March 1942 traffic was 4,365 passengers or 25 per cent. The load factor of Canadian carriers operating over licensed routes was 79 per cent for carriers reporting available seat miles. These accounted for 77 per cent of the total passenger miles. For the international carriers the load factor was 62 per cent (the load factor is the ratio of passenger miles, revenue and non revenue to the available seat miles).

Freight traffic increased from 980,246 lbs. in March last year to 1,128,882 lbs., and mail increased from 391,995 to 600,927 lbs.

Revenues of Canadian licensed carriers increased from \$870,243 in March, 1942 to \$1,230,453. Operating expenses increased from \$843,183 to \$1,139,167, and net operating revenues increased from \$27,060 to \$91,286.

Averages per aircraft mile were 6.0 passengers, 228 pounds of freight and 287 pounds of mail as compared with 4.9, 181 and 182 respectively, in March 1942.
