CIVIL AVIATION

JULY. 1943

Revenue passengers carried by aircraft during July increased to 30,889 from 28,523 in June and 20,162 in July last year. Freight carried increased from 973,351 lbs. in June to 1,023,424 lbs., but was below last year's traffic of 1,119,721 lbs. Mail continued to increase, amounting to 612,072 lbs. as compared with 595,070 lbs. in June and 378,293 lbs. in July last year.

Gasoline consumption increased from 485,484 gallons in 1942 to 606,842 gallons, but on a horse power hour basis declined from an average of 39.6 in July last year to 37.0 gallons. The average aircraft speed and number of passengers per aircraft also showed increases but the average passenger journey decreased from 330 to 323 miles.

The load ratio computed by Canadian air carriers carrying 69 per cent of the passenger miles was 87 per cent and for International carriers it was 75 per cent.
