CIVIL AVIATION SUMMARY OF MONTHLY REPORTS 1945

The reports of civil air carriers making monthly reports to the Bureau are summarized here for 1945 with comparable data for 1942. A transfer of data from unlicensed carriers to licensed carriers in 1942 was made to make data for both years comparable and some revisions in the monthly data were made in these total data.

The number of revenue passengers carried increased by 39.4 per cent or from 214,691 in 1942 to 299,279 in 1945. The number of company employees carried and non revenue passengers decreased, making the increase in all personnel carried 82,604 or 36.2 per cent. The increase in international travel between Canada and the United States and Newfoundland was 77.5 per cent, excluding the through traffic between United States and Alaska. In freight carried the large increase was also in the international traffic where an increase was made of 855,820 lbs., or, after deducting the through traffic, an increase of 445,934 lbs. or 142 per cent; excess baggage is computed as freight. Mail increased from 5,258,071 to 7,393,812 lbs. or by 40.6 per cent, and the international mail into and out of Canada increased from 535,854 to 1,102,050 lbs. or by 106 per cent. The Newfoundland route was started in May, 1942, which would affect the comparison. Gasoline consumption of Canadian carriers and purchases in Canada by foreign carriers increased from 4,980,873 to 6.015.885 gallons or by 20.8 per cent. The monthly average number of employees increased from 2,092 to 3,476 and the total pay roll increased from \$4,503,569 to \$6,521,580. This includes all employees of Canadian carriers and Canadian employees of international carriers. Operating revenues of Canadian licensed carriers increased from \$11,911,145 to \$15,875,319 or by 55.3 per cent, but operating expenses increased by 42.0 per cent reducing the net operating revenue from \$691,222 to a debit of \$55,078.

The average speed of aircraft in revenue service increased from 138 to 144 miles per hour or by 4 per cent. The number of revenue passengers per aircreft mile increased by 25.4 per cent and the average journey increased from 330 to 336 miles, and for Canadian licensed carriers from 388 to 407 miles. The average gaseline consumption of Canadian licensed carriers per aircraft hour increased from 49.1 to 53.4 gallons or by 8.8 per cent, but on a horse power hour basis decreased by 8.7 per cent.

There were no serious accidents during 1945, the number of passengers killed being 2 for over 94,000,000 passenger miles flown by licensed carriers, and one passenger was injured. The unlicensed carriers include the Provincial air services engaged largely in forest protection. The Ontario Government air service had one accident in which the pilot was injured and three passengers were killed, but other unlicensed carriers operated without any accidents involving personal injuries.
