CIVIL AVIATION

JANUARY, 1944.

Revenue passengers travelling by aircraft during January increased to 26,146 from 14,380 for January, 1943, or by 82 per cent. Freight traffic also increased by 35 per cent or from 795,701 to 1,074,701 lbs., and mail shows a slight increase when the through traffic is deducted from 1944 poundage. Data for through mail was not collected in January 1943.

The number of employees increased from 2,555 in 1943 to 3,988 and the pay roll increased from \$446,095 to \$682,220.

The average aircraft speed increased from 143 to 145 miles per hour; the number of revenue passengers per aircraft mile increased from 5.6 to 6.5, but the average journey decreased from 384 to 335 miles. This is affected by the short flights in Canada of International carriers, but the average journey for Canadian licensed carriers also decreased from 428 to 405 miles.

The load factor for carriers reporting available seat miles was 80 per cent for Canadian licensed carriers and 60 per cent for International carriers. These factors were computed on 100 per cent of International traffic and 75 per cent of Canadian traffic.

Available seat miles are not computed for certain classes of operation in the north country.
