Civil air carriers transported 39,683 passengers during November as compared with 27,648 in November, 1944. Passengers on international routes increased from 13,501 to 17,618 or by 30.5 per cent. These included local passengers in Newfoundland carried by the Trans-Canada Air Lines, and through passengers (1,400 in 1944 and 499 in 1945) between United States and Alaska, in addition to passengers between Canadian and Foreign airports. Passengers on Canadian routes increased from 14,147 to 22,065 or by 56 per cent. Passengers carried by two or more carriers on a trip are counted only once. The average journey in Canada declined from 389 to 365 miles. Freight increased from 323,313 to 438,409 lbs., and mail decreased from 522,154 to 403,786 lbs., or by 29 per cent, whereas mail ton miles decreased by 36 per cent.

Operating revenues of Canadian carriers increased from \$1,078,011 in 1944 to \$1,169,977, and operating expenses from \$1,296,280 to \$1,379,359, which reduced the loss from operation from \$218,269 to \$209,382. These do not include interest and other deductions from income.

The revenue passenger load factor for international routes declined from 72.6 in November, 1944, to 66.5 per cent, and for domestic routes it increased from 74,0 to 76.9 per cent. This factor is the ratio of revenue passenger miles to available seat miles. These were computed for all international traffic and for 85 per cent of the domestic traffic. Because of the nature of their business it was not feasible to compute available seat miles for carriers reporting 15 per cent of the total domestic passenger miles.
