Civil air carriers transported 36,719 revenue passengers during May as compared with 32,858 in April and 34,778 in May last year. The increase was all in international traffic which increased from 12,481 in 1944 to 15,043 passengers, traffic between Canadian airports declining by 621 passengers.

Freight carried increased to 823,332 from 708,134 lbs. in May, 1944, and revenue ton miles increased to 98,826 from 92,746.

Mail ton miles declined from 174,421 to 169,392. Here, also, there was an increase in international traffic which increased from 6,123 to 7,692 ton miles or by 26 per cent.

Revenues of licensed Canadian carriers declined to \$1,340,024 from \$1,492,544 in 1944 and operating expenses declined to \$1,360,621 from \$1,570,454 which reduced the operating deficit to \$20,597 from \$77,910.

The number of employees was reduced from 4,461 in May, 1944, to 4,083 and the pay roll from \$756,329 to \$729,532.

The average number of revenue passengers per aircraft mile was increased from 7.9 to 8.1, the increase for international travel being from 10.5 to 10.8 passengers.

The revenue passenger load factor for Canadian carriers declined from 83.6 to 81.9 per cent and for international carriers from 59.5 to 56.7 per cent. Coupled with an increase in passengers per aircraft mile this indicates a greater increase in capacity than in passenger traffic for both classes of carriers.
