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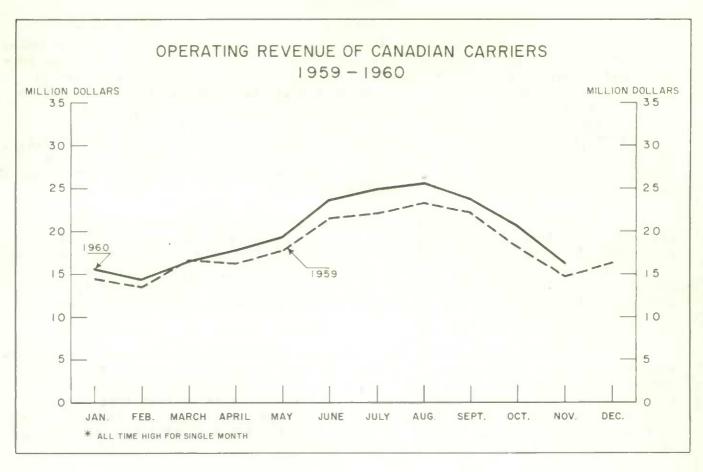
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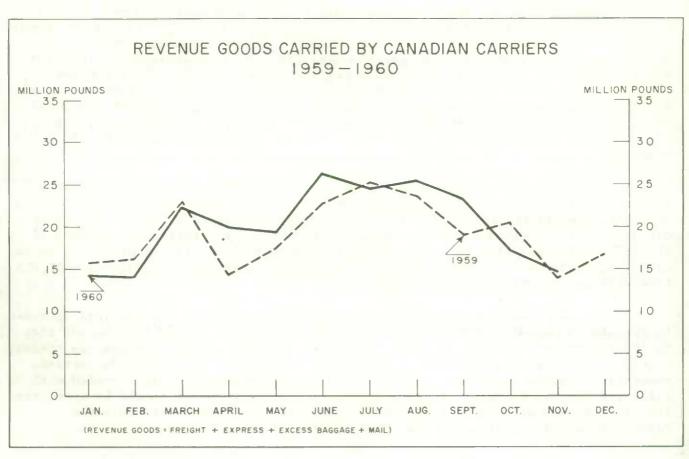

INTRODUCTION

In November, there was a slight decrease in the number of revenue passengers transported by Canadian Air carriers, as compared with the corresponding month of 1959, but the volume of goods carried was substantially higher. Passengers decreased .9 per cent to 324,913 from 327,962 whereas goods rose 6.1 per cent to 14,783,385 lbs. from 13,938,712 lbs. Revenue miles flown declined 5.8 per cent to 6,663,926 from 7,072,621 in the previous month of November. Both operating revenues and operating expenses were up, the revenues rising 9.1 per cent to \$16,178,552 from \$14,829,200 and the expenses increasing 12.5 per cent to \$19,722,-628 from \$17,534,526. The operating loss of \$3,544,076 was larger than the one reported in November 1959 (\$2,705,326) and the deficit, after provision for income taxes, rose to \$3,964,873 from \$2,946,562 last year.

In the eleven month period, January to November, more revenue passengers and more revenue goods were carried than in the same period of 1959. The number of passengers increased 2.9 per cent to 4,381,812 from 4,259,127 and the volume of goods rose 4.7 per cent to 221,548,197 lbs. from 211,625,017 lbs. Operating revenues increased 8.6 per cent in the period, to \$218,246,833 from \$201,027,978, but did not keep pace with operating expenses which rose 11 per cent to \$219,739,017 from \$197,954,460.

In the month of November, 95.4 per cent of the total revenue passengers and 64.1 per cent of the total revenue goods were carried on unit toll services. Corresponding figures for the same month of 1959 are 95 per cent and 68.5 per cent respectively. It should be noted that a complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled services is not possible since some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

The six scheduled carriers transported, in November, 1960, 305,332 revenue passengers or 94 per cent of the total and 9,403,306 lbs. of revenue goods or 63.6 per cent of the total. In November, 1959, these scheduled carriers transported 310,420 revenue passengers or 94.7 per cent of all passengers carried and 9,265,570 lbs. of revenue goods or 66.5 per cent of the total. The scheduled carriers also earned, this year, 89.8 per cent of the operating revenues reported by all Canadian air carriers and were responsible for 87.4 per cent of the total operating expenses. In November of the previous year, the scheduled carriers reported 89.6 per cent of the total revenues and 87.8 per cent of the total expenses.

Data for companies operating helicopters only are shown in Table 8. Such companies operate approximately 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. In November, they flew a total of 961 revenue hours as compared with 1,430 hours in October. They reported operating revenues of \$251,147 and operating expenses of \$568,877, which resulted in an operating loss of \$317,730. In the preceding month, operating revenues amounted to \$292,028 and operating expenses aggregated \$381,255, resulting in an operating loss of \$89,227.

In November, for the first time in 1960, foreign air carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported fewer revenue passengers to and from Canada than in the corresponding month of 1959. The total numbered 45,556 this year as against 47,019 in the previous November, a drop of 3.1 per cent. Revenue goods carried, however, increased sharply to 1,457,248 lbs. in November, 1960, as compared with 1,155,762 lbs. in November, 1959, a rise of 26.1 per cent. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- the scheduled services, which provide transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points.

Bulk Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per mile or per hour for the entire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract.

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising.

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled service.

Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus one major transport carrier: Nordair Ltd.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air Cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Passenger Load Factors:

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to availa-

ble seat-miles.

Weight Load Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available

ton-miles.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from

other operating divisions of the same carrier

(division interline).

International Services:

Trans Border Services:

Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico or South America.

Trans Atlantic and Polar

Services:

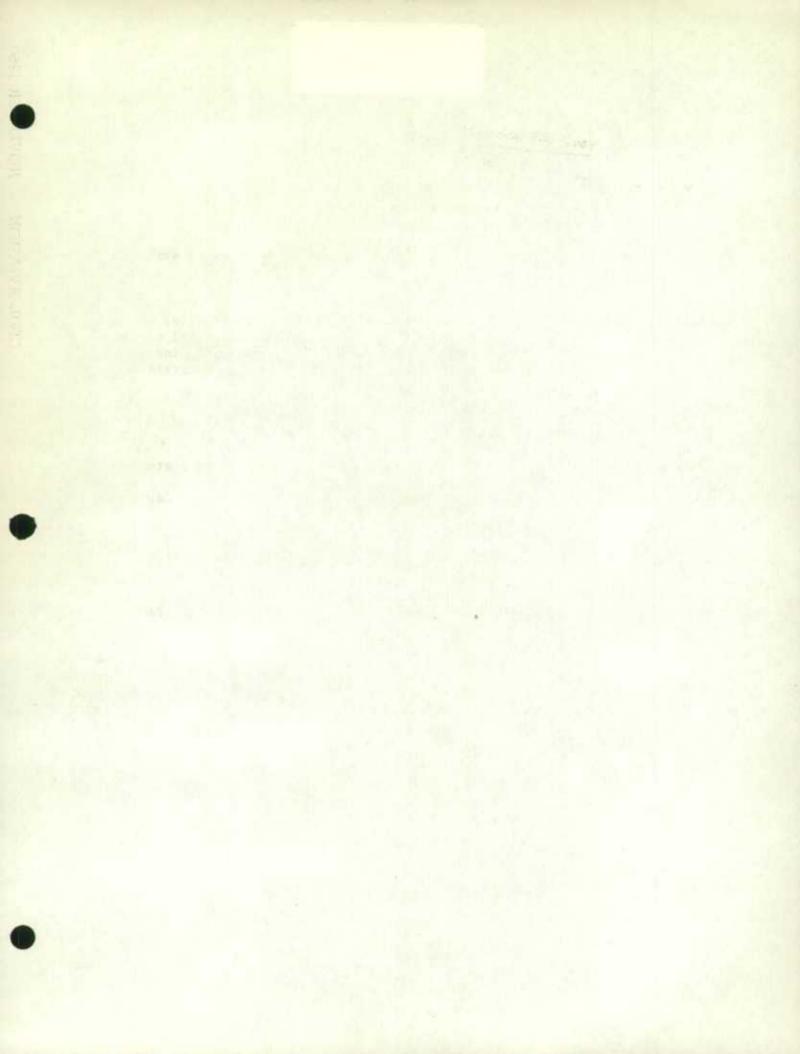
Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services:

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific

Ocean or the Orient.



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
