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
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

#### INTRODUCTION

During the month of July 1960, the number of revenue passengers transported by Canadian air carriers increased 4.3 per cent to 488,897 from 468,935 in July 1959, while the revenue goods carried declined 2.7 per cent to 24,441,373 lbs. from 25,129,499 lbs. for the same month of the previous year. Revenue miles flown also decreased 2.5 per cent to 10,830,918 from 11,108,876. Operating revenues were up 13.2 per cent to \$24,942,216 from \$22,026,808, and operating expenses rose 12.6 per cent to \$21,733,459 from \$19,305,920. The operating income for July was 17.9 per cent higher than the previous year, amounting to \$3,208,757 as compared with \$2,720,888 and the net income (after provision for income taxes) increased 21.5 per cent to \$2,750,675 from \$2,263,798.

Total revenue passengers and revenue goods carried from January 1st to July 31st, 1960, were greater than for the same period in 1959. The number of revenue passengers rose to 2,689,225 from 2,586,599, an increase of 4.0 per cent, while revenue goods rose to 140,751,419 lbs. from 134,778,113 lbs., an increase of 4.4 per cent. Operating revenues and expenses also increased, but revenues were up by only 7.6 per cent to \$132,054,352 from \$122,674,022 while expenses rose 11.1 per cent to \$136,307,763 from \$122,660,432.

In July 79.3 per cent of the revenue passengers and 38.2 per cent of all revenue goods were carried on unit toll services as compared with 83.7 per cent and 36.1 per cent respectively in the same month of 1959. It should be noted that a complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled services is not possible since some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases, the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

During July the six scheduled carriers transported 386,848 revenue passengers, 79.1 per cent of the total revenue passengers carried, and 10,609,859 lbs. of revenue goods, 43.4 per cent of the total. In the same month of 1959, seven scheduled carriers transported 396,440 passengers, or 84.5 per cent of the total and 9,773,476 lbs. of revenue goods or 38.9 per cent of the total. The scheduled carriers also accounted for 81.7 per cent of the total operating revenues and 85.6 per cent of the total operating expenses, as compared with 82.4 and 85.4 per cent respectively in July of the previous year.

Table 8 shows data for companies operating helicopters only. These companies operate 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. During the month of July the operating revenues were slightly higher than for the previous month, totalling \$1,037,494 compared with \$935,419 for June, while the operating expenses remained practically the same, totalling \$505,238 compared with \$457,359 for June. As a result the net income (after provision for income taxes) showed an increase of 48.1 per cent, rising to \$540,719 from \$365,088.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 8.5 per cent more passengers and 1.9 per cent more revenue goods in July this year than in the same month of 1959. The number of passengers carried totalled 71,987 in 1960 as against 65,903 in 1959 and the revenue goods carried in 1960 aggregated 1,233,131 lbs., compared with 1,210,250 lbs., in the previous year. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and intransit passengers are excluded.

#### CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per Unit Toll Transportation: It includes: unit. the scheduled services, which provide transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and the non-scheduled services, which provide (ii) transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points. Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per Bulk Transportation: mile or per hour for the entire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract. Non-transportation flying services, such as flying Specialty Flying Services: training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising. Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service. Scheduled Carriers: Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled Non-Scheduled Carriers: service. Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers: Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines. Group I Carriers: Group II Carriers: All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus two major transport carriers: Nordair Ltd. and Wheeler Air Lines Ltd. All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of Group III Carriers: \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II. Group IV Carriers: All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.
