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
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

### INTRODUCTION

During the month of January, Canadian air carriers transported 4.3 per cent more revenue passengers and 0.3 per cent more revenue goods than in the first month of 1960. Passengers carried increased to 343,932 from 329,709 and goods rose to 14,420,621 lbs. from 14,378,313 lbs. Revenue miles flown declined substantially to 6,966,063 from 7,551,082. Both operating revenues and operating expenses were up, the revenues rising 8.5 per cent to \$16,919,117 from \$15,599,168 and the expenses increasing 11 per cent to \$20,007,893 from \$18,018,614. The operating deficit for the month, therefore, was greater than the deficit reported in January, 1960, amounting to \$3,088,776 as compared with \$2,419,446 in the previous year. The deficit, after provision for income taxes, rose to \$3,718,816 from \$2,773,078.

A total of 328,635 revenue passengers or 95.6 per cent of all passengers carried and 8,709,189 lbs. of revenue goods or 60.4 per cent of all goods were transported on unit toll services. In January, 1960, 314,824 revenue passengers or 95.5 per cent of the total and 7,941,937 lbs. of revenue goods or 55.2 per cent of the total were carried on these same services. A complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled services is not possible since some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases, the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

In January, 1961, the six scheduled carriers transported considerably more revenue passengers than in the corresponding month of the previous year but their share of the total traffic remained approximately the same. Passengers carried amounted to 322,056 or 93.8 per cent of the total as against 307,846 or 93.4 per cent in 1960. These carriers also transported, in January, 1961, 8,561,521 lbs. of revenue goods or 59.4 per cent of all revenue goods carried as compared with 8,874,-632 lbs. or 61.7 per cent in January, 1960. The scheduled carriers were also responsible for 90 per cent of the operating revenues earned by Canadian air carriers and for 90.2 per cent of the operating expenses. Corresponding percentages for January, 1960, were 90.7 per cent and 89.2 per cent, respectively.

Table 7 presents information on specialty flying services of Canadian air carriers. During the month, a total of 3,716 revenue hours were flown as compared with 3,689 hours in the first month of 1960. Revenues reported amounted to \$291,907, well above the total revenue of \$160,634 recorded in the previous January.

Data for companies operating helicopters only are shown in Table 8. These companies operated 100 aircraft in January, 1961, approximately 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. They flew 735 revenue hours, an increase of 5.6 per cent over the 696 revenue hours flown in the corresponding month of 1960. Their operating revenues rose to \$191,999 from \$113,259, a gain of 69.5 per cent, whereas their operating expenses advanced 8.8 per cent to \$321,301 from \$295,436. The operating deficit was, therefore, reduced to \$129,302 from \$179,756.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 51,322 revenue passengers in the first month of 1961, approximately the same number reported in January of the previous year (51,738). Revenue goods carried advanced 28.9 per cent, however, to 1,477,933 lbs. in 1961 from 1,146,413 lbs. in 1960. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

### CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- (i) the scheduled services, which provide transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points.

Bulk Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per mile or per hour for the entire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract.

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising.

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled service.

Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus one major transport carrier: Nordair Ltd.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air Cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Passenger Load Factors:

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to availa-

ble seat-miles.

Weight Load Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available

ton-miles.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from

other operating divisions of the same carrier

(division interline).

International Services:

Trans Border Services:

Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico or South America.

Trans Atlantic and Polar

Services:

Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services:

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific

Ocean or the Orient.

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
