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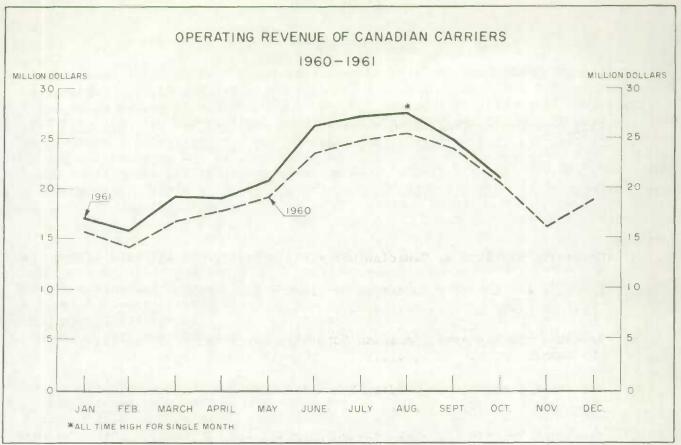
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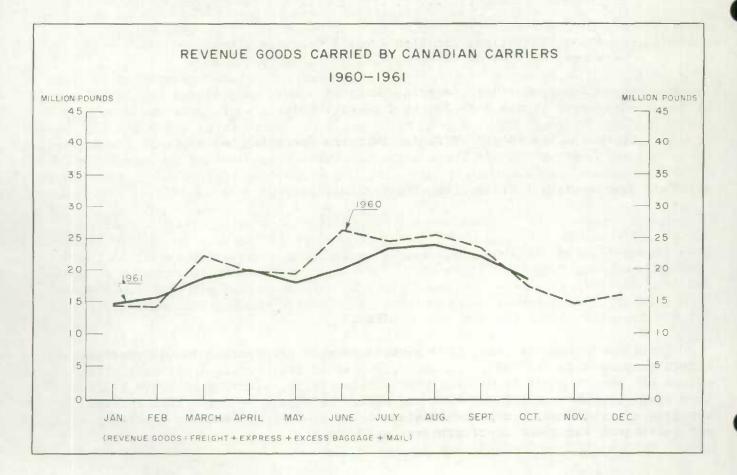

Introduction

In October, 1961, Canadian air carriers transported 3.4 per cent fewer revenue passengers but 9.5 per cent more revenue goods than in October, 1960. Passengers carried decreased to 431,383 from 446,350, while goods flown increased to 18,425,-383 lbs. from 16,824,240 lbs. Revenue miles flown declined 8.8 per cent to 7,748,-796 from 8,493,936. Both operating revenues and expenses registered increases, as revenues rose 1.7 per cent to \$20,889,781 from \$20,540,272 and expenses 3.9 per cent to \$21,630,690 from \$20,825,047. As a result the operating deficit for the month increased to \$740,909 from \$284,775. The net deficit, after provision for income taxes and other charges, amounted to \$1,459,659 as against that of \$638,202 in October of the previous year.

In the ten month period, January to October, Canadian air carriers transported 2.8 per cent more revenue passengers in contrast to 4.8 per cent less revenue goods than in the corresponding period of 1960. The number of revenue passengers carried rose to 4,170,162 from 4,056,899, but the volume of goods flown dropped to 194,-400,074 lbs. from 204,181,248 lbs. Operating revenues were substantially higher, rising 8.5 per cent to \$219,289,021 from \$202,154,046, whereas operating expenses rose 8.8 per cent to \$217,752,027 from \$200,062,627.

A total of 400,391 or 92.8 per cent of all revenue passengers carried and 10,-078,253 lbs. or 54.7 per cent of all revenue goods were transported in unit toll service this month. In October, 1960, 376,994 revenue passengers or 84.5 per cent of the total and 9,140,174 lbs. of revenue goods or 52.9 per cent of the total were carried in this type of service. A complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled is not possible as some carriers offer both on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

During the month under review, the six schedules carriers transported 392,090 revenue passengers or 90.9 per cent of the total number carried and 10,171,853 lbs. of revenue goods or 55.2 per cent of the total. Comparable figures for October, 1960 were 370,386 revenue passengers or 83 per cent of the total and 9,359,152 lbs. of revenue goods or 54.2 per cent of the total. The scheduled carriers also accounted for 89 per cent of the operating revenues and 87.9 per cent of the operating expenses reported by Canadian air carriers. Corresponding figures for October of the previous year were 88.5 and 86.4 per cent respectively.

Table 8 shows data for companies flying helicopters only. These companies operate approximately 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. In October, 1961 they flew a total of 2,135 revenue hours, an increase of 49.3 per cent from the 1,430 hours flown in October, 1960. The operating revenues increased 49.6 to \$436,-802 from \$292,028 while the operating expenses increased 19.1 per cent to \$454,219 from \$381,255. As a result the operating loss for the month decreased sharply to \$17,417 from \$89,227 in the previous October.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 75,014 revenue passengers compared with 61,838 in October 1960, an increase of 21.3 per cent. The volume of revenue goods flown also rose substantially, climbing to 2,196,193 lbs. from 1,484,881 lbs., a gain of 47.9 per cent. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

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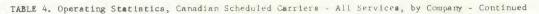

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation: Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per unit. It includes: the scheduled services, which provide transpor-(i) tation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points. Bulk Transportation: Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per mile or per hour for the entrire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract. Specialty Flying Services: Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising. Scheduled Carriers: Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service. Non-Scheduled Carriers: Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled service. Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers: Group I Carriers: Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines. Group II Carriers: All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus one major transport carrier: Nordair Limited. Group III Carriers: All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II. Group IV Carriers: All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000. Group V Carriers: All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available seat-miles.

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.

Air Cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Interline Traffic: Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from other operating divisions of the same carrier (division interline).

International Services:

Trans Border Services:	Services between Canada and the United States.
Southern Services:	Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Mexico or South America.
Trans Atlantic and Polar Services:	Services between Canada and Europe.
Pacific and Orient Services:	Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean or the Orient.
