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



INTRODUCTION

In September, 1961, Canadian air carriers transported 6.6 per cent more revenue passengers, but 3.2 per cent less revenue goods than in September, 1960. Passengers carried rose to 474,316 from 445,132, while goods flown decreased to 22,018,418 lbs. from 22,746,649 lbs. Revenue miles flown declined 8.8 per cent to 8,989,255 from 9,854,651. Both operating revenues and expenses registered increases, as revenues rose 3.8 per cent to \$24,851,965 from \$23,942,255 and expenses 9 per cent to \$23,-205,931 from \$21,292,093. As a result, the operating income declined to \$1,646,034 from \$2,650,162 and the net income after provision for income taxes and other charges dropped to \$663,736 from \$2,145,548 in September, 1960.

For the first nine months of 1961, more revenue passengers but less revenue goods were carried than in the same period of 1960. The number of passengers increased 3.6 per cent to 3,738,779 from 3,610,549 while the volume of goods decreased 6.1 per cent to 175,974,691 lbs. from 187,357,008 lbs. During the same period, both operating revenues and expenses were higher. Revenues rose 9.1 per cent to \$198,152,198 from \$181,613,774 and expenses increased 9.3 per cent to \$195,976,815 from \$179,237,580.

In the month of September, 1961, 90.7 per cent of the total revenue passengers and 45.4 per cent of the total revenue goods were carried in unit toll services. Corresponding figures for the same month of 1960 were 90.4 per cent and 41.4 per cent respectively. It should be noted that a complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled is not possible since some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

During the month under review, the six scheduled carriers transported 419,749 revenue passengers or 88.5 per cent of the total number carried and 11,235,858 lbs. of revenue goods or 51 per cent of the total. In September of the previous year 87.5 per cent of the revenue passengers and 38.4 per cent of the revenue goods were transported by the scheduled carriers.

Table 8 shows data for companies operating helicopters only. These companies operate approximately 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. In September, 1961, they flew a total of 6,347 revenue hours as compared with 5,008 in September, 1960. Operating revenues totalled \$873,657 and operating expenses amounted to \$650,883 compared with revenues of \$488,370 and expenses of \$259,563 in September of the previous year.

Tables 10 and 11 cover operations of the Group V carriers which report quarterly. The information presented in these two tables is excluded from all other tables of the report. During the third quarter of 1961 these carriers transported 46,407 revenue passengers as against 45,865 and 3,094,483 lbs. of revenue goods as compared with 3,062,289 lbs. in the corresponding period of 1960.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 79,967 revenue passengers and 1,606,552 lbs. of revenue goods in September. This represents an increase of 12.5 per cent over the number of passengers carried in September, 1960, (71,694), and a 9.9 per cent increase in the volume of revenue goods (1,462,287 lbs.) It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- the scheduled services, which provide transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points.

Bulk Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per mile or per hour for the entire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract.

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising.

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled service.

Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus one major transport carrier: Nordair Limited.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air Cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Passenger Load Factors:

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to availa

ble seat-miles.

Weight Load Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available

ton-miles.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from

other operating divisions of the same carrier

(division interline).

International Services:

Trans Border Services:

Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico or South America.

Trans Atlantic and Polar

Services:

Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services:

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific

Ocean or the Orient.

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
