



#### INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described in the last two pages of this publication along with definitions of civil aviation terminology. It should be noted, however, that Nordair Ltd. and Eastern Provincial Airways Ltd., which are classified as Group II carriers by the Air Transport Board, have been included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V comprises the small carriers which are required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from industry totals appearing throughout the report.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except number 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for the three Canadian carriers operating international unit toll services: Canadian Pacific Air Lines, Transair Ltd. and Trans-Canada Air Lines. Statistics on revenue passengers, cargo and mail transported are now being included in this table.

Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. However, a complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Table 9 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded. The table now includes the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers.

Statistics on aircraft owned and leased by Canadian carriers are presented in Table 10 for each group of carriers, by category of aircraft and weight group.

#### Review of July operations

During the month of July, 1962, Canadian air carriers transported more revenue goods and more revenue passengers than in July of the previous year. Passengers carried rose 8.7 per cent to 519,618 from 477,901 and the volume of goods flown increased 7.2 per cent to 25,027,064 lbs. from 23,354,147 lbs. Revenue miles flown increased 4.4 per cent to 10,703,918 from 10,256,118. Operating revenues rose 12.1 per cent to \$30,430,077(an all time high for a single month) from \$27,155,067 while operating expenses increased 8.4 per cent to \$25,674,665 from \$23,693,048. As a result, the operating income of \$4,755,412 was substantially higher than that of \$3,462,019 reported in July, 1961 and the net income, after provision for income taxes and other charges, rose to \$3,586,515 from \$2,602,066.

For the first seven months of 1962 both the number of revenue passengers and the volume of revenue goods carried registered significant increases in comparison with the same period a year earlier. Revenue passengers carried increased 11.8 per cent to 3,086,156 from 2,760,783 while revenue goods transported rose 10.6 per cent to 143,313,672 lbs. from 129,996,742 lbs. Operating revenues for the period were up 11.6 per cent to \$162,366,618 from \$145,532,760 and operating expenses rose 7.5 per cent to \$160,293,494 from \$149,053,458.

In July, the six scheduled carriers transported 437,299 revenue passengers or 84.2 per cent of the total number carried and 12,043,777 lbs. of revenue goods or 48.1 per cent of the total. Comparable figures for July, 1961, were 413,116 revenue passengers or 86.4 per cent of the total and 11,014,666 lbs. of revenue goods or 47.2 per cent of the total. The scheduled carriers also accounted for 83.5 per cent of the operating revenues and 85.9 per cent of the operating expenses. Corresponding figures for July of the previous year were 84 per cent and 86.6 per cent respectively.

Table 8 shows data for companies flying helicopters only. These companies operate approximately 70 per cent of all commercial helicopters in Canada. In July, 1962, the revenue hours flown amounted to 10,517, virtually unchanged from the 10,582 hours flown in July, 1961.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 75,277 revenue passengers compared with 86,141 in July 1961. However, the volume of revenue goods carried rose 16.9 per cent to 1,908,689 lbs. from 1,632,352 lbs. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

#### CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation: Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes.

- (i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule (Class 1); and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
  - (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising (Class 7).

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating a scheduled (Class 1) service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class 1) service.

Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled (Class I) service plas two major transport carriers: Nordair Ltd. and Eastern Provincial Airways Ltd.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Group I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000 and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Passenger:

A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip. For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger and a round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.

Revenue Passenger:

A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is paid.

Non-Revenue Passenger:

A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation flight for whom no fare is collected, including company personnel.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Tons:

Short tons of 2,000 lbs.

Miles:

Statute miles of 5,280 ft.

Passenger-Mile:

The transportation of one passenger over the distance of one mile.

Available Seat-Miles:

Seats available for the transportation of passengers multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station trip.

Passenger Load Factor: Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available seat-miles.

Ton-Mile: The transportation of one ton of load over the distance of one mile.

Available Load: Load capacity available for the transportation of goods and passengers after deduction of the operating load of gas and oil, crew, stewards'

supplies, etc.

Available Ton-Miles: Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on each inter-station

trip.

Weight Load Factor: Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.

Interline Traffic: Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline)

or from other operating divisions of the same carrier (division interline).

International Services:

Trans-Border Services: Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services: Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Mexico or South America.

Trans-Atlantic and
Polar Services: Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services: Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean or the Orient.

Five Freedoms of the Air:

First Freedom: The right to fly over the territory of a foreign country without landing.

Second Freedom: The right to land on the territory of a foreign country for non-traffic

purposes.

Third Freedom: The right to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo

taken on in the territory of the state whose nationality the aircraft

possesses.

Fourth Freedom: The right to take on in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo

destined for the territory of the state whose nationality the aircraft

possesses.

Fifth Freedom: The right to take on in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo

destined for the territory of any other foreign state and the right to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo coming from any

such territory.
