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
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

INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described in the last two pages of this publication along with definitions of civil aviation terminology. It should be noted, however, that Nordair Ltd. and Eastern Provincial Airways Ltd. which are classified as Group II carriers by the Air Transport Board, have been included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V comprises the small carriers which are required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from industry totals appearing throughout the report.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except number 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for the two Canadian carriers operating international unit toll services: Canadian Pacific Air Lines, and Trans-Canada Air Lines.

Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. However, a complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Table 9 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded. The table includes the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers, with separate totals for each.

Review of January Operations

In January 1963, the number of revenue passengers transported by Canadian air carriers dropped slightly, although there was a significant increase in the volume of goods flown as compared with the corresponding month of 1962. Passengers carried decreased by less than 1 per cent to 390,302 from 393,897, but goods transported rose 6.1 per cent to 15,441,624 lbs. from 14,559,159 lbs. Revenue miles flown were virtually unchanged, as they decreased only 0.4 per cent to 6,995,512 from 7,023,955. Operating revenues rose 10.9 per cent to \$20,380,784 from \$18,376,449 a year earlier, while operating expenses increased 3.8 per cent to \$22,183,968 from \$21,364,593. As a result the operating loss of \$1,803,184 was considerably lower than that of \$2,988,144 reported in January, 1961 and the deficit after provision for income taxes and other charges, decreased to \$2,722,544 from \$3,999,319.

During January, 1963 the six scheduled carriers transported 365,162 revenue passengers or 93.6 per cent of the total number carried and 10,507,006 lbs. of revenue goods or 68 per cent of the total. Comparable figures for January, 1962 are 367,104 revenue passengers or 93.2 per cent of the total and 9,670,198 lbs. of revenue goods or 66.4 per cent of the total. The scheduled carriers also accounted for 92.6 per cent of the operating revenues and 91.7 per cent of the operating expenses reported by Canadian air carriers. Corresponding figures for January of the previous year are 91.2 per cent and 90.3 per cent respectively.

Table 7 shows data on the different types of specialty flying performed by Canadian carriers. During the month under review, operators performing these services reported 3,241 hours of flying and revenues of \$182,689. In the same month of 1962, 3,218 hours of specialty flying were flown with the revenues amounting to \$159,553.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 58,464 revenue passengers in January, 1963 as compared with 64,102 in January 1962, a decrease of 8.8 per cent. In contrast, the volume of revenue goods flown by these same carriers rose 3.8 per cent to 1,886,885 lbs. from 1,817,-421 lbs. It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

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CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:	 Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes: (i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule (Class 1); and (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).
Bulk Transportation:	 (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).
Specialty Flying Services:	Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising (Class 7).
Scheduled Carriers:	Carriers operating a scheduled (Class 1) service.
Non-Scheduled Carriers:	Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class 1) service.
Classification of Canadian Carriers:	
Group I Carriers:	Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.
Group II Carriers:	All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled (Class I) service plus two major transport carriers: Nordair Ltd. and Eastern Provincial Airways Ltd.
Group III Carriers:	All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Group I and II.
Group IV Carriers:	All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000 and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.
Group V Carriers:	All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.
Passenger:	A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip. For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger and a round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.
Revenue Passenger:	A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is paid.
Non-Revenue Passenger:	A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation flight for whom no fare is collected, including company personnel.
Air Cargo:	Air freight and air express.
Goods:	Air cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.
Tons:	Short tons of 2,000 lbs.
Miles:	Statute miles of 5,280 ft.
Passenger-Mile:	The transportation of one passenger over the distance of one mile.
