

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
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

INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described in the last two pages of this publication along with definitions of civil aviation terminology. It should be noted, however, that Nordair Ltd. which is classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Board, has been included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V comprises the small carriers which are required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from industry totals appearing throughout the report.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except number 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for the two Canadian carriers operating international unit toll services: Canadian Pacific Air Lines, and Trans-Canada Air Lines.

Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. However, a complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Table 9 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded. The table includes the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers, with separate totals for each.

Review of November Operations

Increases were reported in the transportation of both revenue passengers and goods by Canadian air carriers during the month of November, compared with November 1962. Passengers carried totalled 384,535 an increase of 9.2 per cent and goods transported rose to 8,461 tons, an increase of 19.5 per cent. The revenue miles flown were up 2.8 per cent to 6,356,374.

November operating revenues showed a 13.2 per cent increase over November 1962 to \$20,530,916 while operating expenses rose 4.2 per cent to \$22,421,987. Thus an operating loss of \$1,891,071 was reported. This compares with a loss of \$3,385,351 for the same month the previous year. A net deficit after provision for income taxes of \$2,679,583 was reported as against a deficit of \$4,388,039 in November 1962.

Revenue hours flown by helicopters dropped 1.9 per cent to 982. However, the operating revenues rose 10.4 per cent to \$135,947 while the operating expenses declined 4.9 per cent to \$125,821.

In November the six scheduled carriers transported 362,655 revenue passengers 94.3 per cent of all passengers carried by Canadian services. They also carried 6,466 tons of revenue goods which is 76.4 per cent of the total carried. Operating revenues amounted to \$19,222,000 or 93.6 per cent of all Canadian revenues and operating expenses to \$20,701,579 or 92.3 per cent of the total. Comparable figures in November 1962 are, passengers 93.3 per cent, goods 77.8 per cent, revenues 92.5 per cent and expenses 90.6 per cent.

The Cumulative View

The eleven months of 1963 compared to the same period in 1962 showed the revenue passengers carried increased 12.5 per cent to 5,516,064, while revenue goods rose 1.9 per cent to 114,207 tons. Operating revenues increased 9.0 per cent to \$287,456,413 while operating expenses increased 5.2 per cent to \$267,492,867.

Foreign Carriers

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 58,293 revenue passengers during November, an increase of 11.2 per cent over November 1962, while revenue goods carried totalled 1,002 tons, an increase of 3.6 per cent. Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only. Details of passengers in transit have been excluded.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation: Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- (i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between deaignated points in accordance with a schedule (Class 1); and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Clasa 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).
- Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
 - (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more apecific contracts (Class 5).

Non-transportation flying services, auch as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising (Class 7).

Carriers operating a scheduled (Class 1) aervice.

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class 1) service.

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled (Class 1) service plua one major transport carrier: Nordair Ltd.

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Group I and II.

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000 and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

A person occupying a separate aeat on a one-way trip. For atatistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger and a round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.

A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is paid.

A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation flight for whom no fare is collected, including company personnel.

Air freight and air express.

Air cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Short tons of 2,000 lbs.

Statute miles of 5,280 ft.

The transportation of one passenger over the distance of one mile.

Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on each interstation trip.

Weight Load Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from other operating divisions of the same carrier (division interline).

International Services:

Trans-Border Services:

Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Mexico or South America.

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean or the Orient.

Trans-Atlantic and Polar Services:

Services between Canada and Europe.

Services:

Five Freedoms of the Air:

First Freedom:

The right to fly over the territory of a foreign country without landing.

Second Freedom:

The right to land on the territory of a foreign country for non-traffic purposes.

Third Freedom:


The right to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo taken on in the territory of the state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fourth Freedom:

The right to take on in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of the state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fifth Freedom:

The right to take on in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of any other foreign state and the right to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo coming from any such territory.



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
