#### INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian air carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described on page twenty of this publication along with other definitions. It should be noted that the definition of each of the five groups has been revised as of 1st January, 1964. This revision resulted in four former group III carriers being transferred to Group IV and 24 former Group IV carriers being transferred to Group V. It should also be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Board, is included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V comprises small air carriers required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from the other carrier statistics appearing throughout the report.


Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and nonscheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.


Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Commencing with the January, 1964 issue, bulk transport passenger-miles and goods-ton-miles have been added to the statistical data of this report. However, because of survey limitations, this data refers only to aircraft which has a minimum authorized take-off weight on wheels in excess of 18,000 pounds. Operating data covering bulk international flights have also been added to Table 6. It should be noted, however, that the number of carriers reporting international bulk services may vary from month to month.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded. The table contains the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each.

Also commencing with the January, 1964 issue of "Civil Aviation", data on helicopters have been expanded to include more detail. A split has been made between the use of fixed wing aircraft and helicopters for specialty flying.





#### REVIEW OF DECEMBER OPERATIONS

Increases were reported in the transportation of revenue passengers and revenue goods carried by Canadian Air Carriers during the month of December as compared with December 1963. Passengers carried totalled 423,745, an increase of 13.1 per cent, while goods transported showed an increase of 17.3 per cent to 10,670 tons. The revenue miles flown were up 1.2 per cent to 7,210,379 miles. Passenger miles and goods ton-miles performed by Canadian carriers in unit toll and bulk services totalled 311,-125,832 and 9,989,584 respectively. Unit toll services accounted for 96.3 per cent of the total passenger-miles and 93.4 per cent of the total goods ton-miles.

December operating revenues increased 13.9 per cent over December 1963 to \$24,883,056 while operating expenses increased to \$27,393,501. An operating loss of \$2,510,445 was therefore reported. This compared with an operating loss of \$5,444,120 for the same month of the previous year. A net deficit after provision for income taxes of \$4,163,679 was reported as against a net deficit of \$7,-050,219 in December 1963.

Revenue hours reported flown by 13 carriers who operated 148 helicopters exclusively amounted to 1,923. Hours reported flown by 16 helicopters operated by 7 fixed wing carriers totalled 113. Operating revenues reported by helicopter operators amounted to \$187,745 while operating expenses amounted to \$678,802.

In December the six scheduled carriers transported 400,380 revenue passengers, 94.5 per cent of passengers carried by all Canadian carriers. They also carried 8,953 tons of revenue goods, 83.9 per cent of the total. Operating revenues of scheduled carriers amounted to \$23,634,095 or 95.0 per cent of the total. Operating expenses amounted to \$25,124,876 or 91.7 per cent of the total. Comparable figures for December 1963 are: passengers 93.5 per cent, goods 79.4 per cent, revenues 92.4 per cent and expenses 89.7 per cent.

Revenue passenger-miles performed by Canadian carriers in international unit toll service in December amounted to 123,847,605 or 41.3 per cent of the total unit toll passenger-miles performed by Canadian carriers. The division of international services was as follows:

#### The Cumulative View:

The fourth quarter totals for 1964 compared with the totals for 1963 showed that revenue passengers were up 6.1 per cent to 5,741,122, while revenue goods rose 4.2 per cent to 129,589 tons. Passenger-miles and goods ton-miles performed by Canadian carriers totalled 4,372,481,155 and 105,-560,420 respectively. Operating revenues rose 7.3 per cent to \$332,188,073 while operating expenses rose 5.8 per cent to \$312,098,269.

#### Foreign Carriers:

Foreign carriers licensed to operate in Canada transported 77,841 revenue passengers during December, an increase of 23.7 per cent over December 1963. Revenue goods carried totalled 1,721 tons, an increase of 41.9 per cent. Foreign carriers report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only. Statistics of passengers and goods in transit have been excluded.

#### CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS (1)

Bulk Transportation: (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5). Scheduled Carriers: Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.
