INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating scheduled services in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian air carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described on page twenty of this publication along with other definitions. It should be noted that the definition of each of the five groups was revised as of 1st January 1965. In January 1966, 6 former Group IV carriers were promoted to Group III, and 13 Group V carriers were transferred to Group IV. It should also be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Board, is included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V is comprised of small air carriers required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from the other carrier statistics appearing throughout the report.


Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.


Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. The table contains the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each.

Foreign Carriers

Operations of those foreign carriers having scheduled services into and out of Canada are shown. Bulk transport data is therefore incomplete, since charter services by foreign carriers not otherwise operating in Canada are excluded. Foreign carriers report only hours and miles flown over Canadian territory. Statistics concerning passengers and goods in transit through Canada have been excluded.





REVIEW OF NOVEMBER OPERATIONS

(November 1965 figures in brackets)

Canadian carrier activity as a whole reflects the cessation of Air Canada operations from November 14 to 27 because of a strike. Number of revenue passengers carried was down 20.3 per cent from November 1965 to 368,712 (462,870), while weight of revenue goods carried totalled 9,682 (11,023) tons, a decrease of 12.2 per cent. Revenue miles flown was 9.7 per cent lower at 7,118,642 (7,880,473). Transportation services reported 275,838,926 (321,526,513) revenue passenger-miles and 9,253,171 (11,504,720) goods ton-miles, down 14.2 per cent and 19.6 per cent respectively.

Operating revenues for the month were down 11.7 per cent to \$23,535,864 (\$26,662,554) while operating expenses were up 2.0 per cent to \$30,997,316 (\$30,399,968). As a result, there was an operating loss of \$7,461,452 (\$3,737,414), and a net deficit after adjustment for income taxes of \$4,495,831 (\$4,389,069) for the month.

The seventeen (14) carriers operating helicopters exclusively reported 6,256 (5,437) revenue hours using 205 (164) helicopters. Their operating revenues were \$1,024,907 (\$849,185) and operating expenses totalled \$849,106 (\$844,842). Twelve (8) carriers operating fixed-wing aircraft as well as helicopters reported 625 (356) revenue flying hours with a fleet of 45 (24) helicopters.

The six scheduled carriers transported 331,680 (441,382) revenue passengers, or 90.0 (95.4) per cent of the total for all Canadian carriers. Revenue goods carried totalled 7,365 (9,640) tons, or 76.1 (87.5) per cent of the total by weight. Operating revenues of \$19,976,862 (\$24,451,565) and expenses of \$26,848,260 (\$27,678,250) were reported, accounting for 84.9 (91.7) of Canadian carriers' revenues and 86.6 (91.0) per cent of their operating expenses.

On international unit toll services, Canadian carriers transported 78,930 (118,317) revenue passengers, logging 114,322,110 (127,645,901) passenger-miles, accounting for 23.8 (27.4) per cent of revenue passengers carried and 44.3 (40.6) per cent of passenger-miles reported for all unit toll services. By area of service the proportional breakdown of international passenger-miles was as follows:

Foreign carriers licensed to operate scheduled services in Canada transported 143,854 (86,551) revenue passengers, an increase of 66.2 per cent, and 2,990 (1,807) tons of revenue goods, up 65.5 per cent over November of 1965.

Cumulative Data, Year-to-Date

Over the first eleven months of 1966, Canadian air carriers transported 6,909,814 (6,008,165) passengers, an increase of 15.0 per cent over the same period in 1965. Weight of revenue goods carried rose 22.1 per cent to 165,441 (135,445) tons. Revenue miles flown increased 18.1 per cent to 124,128,336 (105,076,222). Operating revenues totalled \$424,539,064 (\$361,974,117), up 17.3 per cent, while operating expenses were 16.4 per cent higher at \$389,187,358 (\$334,458,700), giving an operating income of \$35,351,706 (\$27,515,417) and a net income after taxes of \$18,887,464 (\$18,061,052) for the first eleven months of the year.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS(1)

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Classification of Canadian Carriers by Groups

Group I Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services. (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).

Group II Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd.(2).

Group III Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).

Group IV Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.

Group V Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.

Cargo:

Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).

Carrier, Air:

Any person who operates aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class I) service.

Scheduled Carriers:

Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.

Express, Air:

It is a package service operated within the U.S.A. and Canada only; the rates cover door-to-door service. Because Air Express shipments are carried on all flights and take priority over Air Freight and because Express shipments receive priority on the ground too, they take higher rates.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier at Canadian Domestic Interline:

points from other Canadian Air Carriers.

Foreign Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier from Foreign

Air Carriers.

Passengers and goods received from other operating Divisional Interline:

divisions of the same carrier.

International Services:

Services between Canada and the United States. Trans-Border Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Southern Services:

Mexico, Central or South America.

Trans-Atlantic and

Polar Services: Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean Services:

or the Orient.

Load Capacity Available: Load capacity available for the transportation of goods

and passengers after deduction of the operating load of

gas and oil, crew, stewards' supplies, etc.

Load Factor, Passenger: Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available

seat-miles.

Load Factor, Weight: - See Weight, Load-Factor.

Miles: Statute miles of 5,280 ft.

Passenger: A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip.

For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as

two passengers.

Passenger Load-Factor: - See Load Factor, Passenger.

Passenger-Mile: The transportation of one passenger one mile.

Non-Revenue Passenger: A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation

flight for whom no fare is collected, including company

personnel.

Revenue Passenger: A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is

paid.

Seat-Miles Available: Seats available for the transportation of passengers

multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station

flight.

Specialty Flying Services: Non-transportation flying services, such as flying

training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and

aerial advertising.

Tons: Short tons of 2,000 lbs.

Ton-Mile: The transportation of one ton of goods one mile.

Ton-Miles Available: Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on

each inter-station flight.

Unit Toll Transportation: Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll

per unit. It includes:

(i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance

with a schedule (Class I); and

(ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity

(Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a de-

fined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Weight Load Factor: Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.

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
