INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Board and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by foreign air carriers operating scheduled services in Canada.

For reporting purposes, Canadian air carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described on page twenty of this publication along with other definitions. It should be noted that the definition of each of the five groups was revised as of 1st January 1965. In January 1966, 6 former Group IV carriers were promoted to Group III, and 13 Group V carriers were transferred to Group IV. It should also be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Board, is included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V is comprised of small air carriers required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from the other carrier statistics appearing throughout the report.


Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.


Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. The table contains the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each.

Foreign Carriers

Operations of those foreign carriers having scheduled services into and out of Canada are shown. Bulk transport data is therefore incomplete, since charter services by foreign carriers not otherwise operating in Canada are excluded. Foreign carriers report only hours and miles flown over Canadian territory. Statistics concerning passengers and goods in transit through Canada have been excluded.





REVIEW OF JUNE OPERATIONS

(June 1965 figures in brackets)

In June, Canadian carriers again reported levels of activity well above last year. An increase of 16.3 per cent in number of passengers carried, to 705,236 (606,412) was overshadowed by one of 28.3 per cent in weight of goods carried, to 16,705 (13,021) tons. Revenue miles flown were up 21.3 per cent to 13,155,693 (10,849,914). Transportation services recorded a total of 570,769,943 (491,408,677) passenger-miles, an increase of 16.1 per cent, and goods ton-miles 12,824,739 (9,734,733), up 31.7 per cent.

Operating revenues for the month were up 18.3 per cent to a record \$44,229,030 (\$37,382,361) while expenses rose 23.7 per cent to \$37,374,458 (\$30,213,121). The resultant operating income was \$6,854,572 (\$7,169,240), with a net income after taxes of \$5,898,158 (\$6,258,029).

The seventeen (15) carriers operating only helicopters in June reported 15,349 (12,737) revenue hours using 216 (183) helicopters. Their operating revenues totalled \$1,945,504 (\$1,658,111) and their operating expenses, \$1,449,813 (\$1,049,716). Twelve (8) carriers operating both fixed-wing and helicopters flew 2,634 (2,061) revenue hours with 36 (31) helicopters.

The six scheduled carriers reported the transportation of 609,582 (536,133) revenue passengers or 86.4 (88.4) per cent of the total for all Canadian carriers, and 10,227 (8,989) tons of revenue goods, which amounted to 61.2 (69.0) per cent of the Canadian carriers total by weight. Operating revenues of \$37,320,380 (\$32,534,658) and expenses of \$32,406,962 (\$27,112,635) were reported, accounting for 84.4 (87.0) per cent of revenues and 86.7 (89.7) per cent of the expenses of all Canadian carriers.

In June, on international unit toll services, Canadian carriers transported 165,447 (149,313) revenue passengers over 219,705,177 (183,928,705) passenger-miles, or 27.3 (28.2) per cent of passengers carried and 43.2 (42.3) per cent of passenger-miles on all unit toll services of Canadian carriers. By area of service, the proportional breakdown of international passenger-miles for the month was as follows:

Foreign carriers licensed to operate scheduled services in Canada transported 158,636 (121,935) revenue passengers and 3,102 (1,594) tons of revenue goods, showing increases of 30.1 per cent and 94.6 per cent respectively over June 1965.

Cumulative Data, Year-to-Date

During the first half of 1966, Canadian air carriers transported 3,487,968 (3,016,189) revenue passengers, an increase of 15.6 per cent. Carriage of revenue goods was up 21.1 per cent by weight to 82,330 (67,987) tons. Revenue miles flown were 17.3 per cent higher at 60,534,815 (51,594,096). Operating revenues totalled \$207,126,330 (\$174,767,907), up 18.5 per cent, while expenses of \$201,490,672 (\$167,342,720) were up 20.4 per cent. The resulting operating profits were \$5,635,658 (\$7,425,187). Net income after taxes was \$653,161 (\$2,136,536).

Foreign carriers operating scheduled services in Canada showed an increase of 28.6 per cent in number of passengers carried, to 722,826 (561,880), and a 55.2 per cent rise in weight of goods carried, to 14,166 (9,128) tons for the first six months of the year.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS (1)

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Classification of Canadian Carriers by Groups

Group I Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services. (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).

Group II Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd.(2).

Group III Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).

Group IV Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.

Group V Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.

Cargo:

Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).

Carrier, Air:

Any person who operates aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class I) service.

Scheduled Carriers:

Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.

Express, Air:

It is a package service operated within the U.S.A. and Canada only; the rates cover door-to-door service. Because Air Express shipments are carried on all flights and take priority over Air Freight and because Express shipments receive priority on the ground too, they take higher rates.

(2) For statistical purposes in this report, Nordair Ltd. is included with Group III carriers.

Freedoms of the Air:

First Freedom: The privilege to fly over the territory of a foreign

country without landing.

Second Freedom: The privilege to land on the territory of a foreign

country for non-traffic purposes.

Third Freedom: The privilege to put down in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo taken on in the territory of the

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fourth Freedom: The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of the

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fifth Freedom: The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of any other foreign state and the privilege to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo coming from

any such territory.

Freight, Air: Articles carried on regular flights at standard per pound

rates when space is available.

Goods: Air Cargo (freight and express) plus mail and excess

baggage.

Interline Traffic:

Domestic Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier at Canadian

points from other Canadian Air Carriers.

Foreign Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier from Foreign

Air Carriers.

Divisional Interline: Passengers and goods received from other operating

divisions of the same carrier.

International Services:

Trans-Border Services: Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services: Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico, Central or South America.

Trans-Atlantic and Polar Services:

Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services: Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean

or the Orient.

Load Capacity Available: Load capacity available for the transportation of goods

and passengers after deduction of the operating load of

gas and oil, crew, stewards' supplies, etc.

Load Factor, Passenger: Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available

seat-miles.

- See Weight, Load-Factor. Load Factor, Weight:

Statute miles of 5,280 ft. Miles:

Passenger: A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip.

> For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as

two passengers.

- See Load Factor, Passenger. Passenger Load-Factor:

The transportation of one passenger one mile. Passenger-Mile:

A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation Non-Revenue Passenger:

flight for whom no fare is collected, including company

personnel.

A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is Revenue Passenger:

paid.

Seat-Miles Available: Seats available for the transportation of passengers

multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station

flight.

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying Specialty Flying Services:

training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and

aerial advertising.

Short tons of 2,000 lbs. Tons:

The transportation of one ton of goods one mile. Ton-Mile:

Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on Ton-Miles Available:

each inter-station flight.

Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll Unit Toll Transportation:

per unit. It includes:

(i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance

with a schedule (Class I); and


(ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity

(Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a de-

fined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).
