



INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Committee, Canadian Transport Commission and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by reporting foreign carriers.

For reporting purposes, Canadian air carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described on the first page of "Civil Aviation Definitions", to be found from page twenty to page twenty-two of this publication. In January 1967, 7 former Group IV carriers were transferred to Group III and 16 Group V carriers to Group IV. It should also be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Committee, is included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V is comprised of small air carriers required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from the other carrier statistics appearing throughout the report.


Certain changes in reporting affect comparability of the data with that of previous years. From 1 April 1966, most mail has been counted at the first loading point only, and not at transfer points as well. While mail ton-miles remain comparable weight carried figures are deflated. Beginning with the July 1966 reports, specialty flying classifications were revised. Aerial Photography and Survey now includes Geophysical Survey. Aerial Inspection, Reconnaissance and Advertising contains services formerly reported under Aerial Advertising and Aerial Patrol and Inspection. Aerial Application and Distribution includes Aerial Fish Cultivation and Aerial Pest Control, Aerial Control activities are those primarily related to fire and weather. This, along with Aerial Construction, and Ambulance and Mercy Services were formerly in Specialty Flying - Other.


Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. The table contains the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each.

Operations of those foreign carriers having scheduled services into and out of Canada are shown. Bulk transport data is therefore incomplete, since charter services by foreign carriers not otherwise operating in Canada are excluded. Foreign carriers report only hours and miles flown over Canadian territory. Statistics concerning passengers and goods in transit through Canada have been excluded.





REVIEW OF JULY OPERATIONS

(July 1966 figures in brackets)

Reports from Ganadian carriers for July showed considerably increased passenger activity and slightly decreased cargo traffic when compared with July 1966 operations. The number of revenue passengers carried was up by 16.9 per cent to 919,606 (786,649) while weight of goods carried was down by 4.9 per cent at 17,194 (18,078) tons. Revenue passenger-miles showed an increase of 14.0 per cent to 838,240,404 (735,261,794) while goods ton-miles decreased 3.3 per cent to 13,800,116 (14,270,112). Revenue miles flown rose 15.4 per cent to 17,016,364 (14,743,377).

July operating revenues of Canadian carriers reached a record high of \$59,883,452 (\$52,578,064) or 13.9 per cent above last year's figure. Operating expenses, increasing by 20.4 per cent, reached \$46,646,083 (\$38,732,315), so that operating income declined by 4.4 per cent to \$13,237,369 (\$13,845,749). Net income after taxes, however, was 33.7 per cent higher at \$12,065,614 (\$9,025,921).

The fifteen (17) carriers operating helicopters exclusively flew 19,520 (18,758) revenue hours using 225 (223) helicopters. Their operating revenues were \$2,478,874 (\$2,231,252) and their operating expenses, \$1,562,540 (\$1,440,479). Ten (10) carriers operating both helicopters and fixed wing aircraft reported 3,041 (2,421) revenue hours with 43 (34) helicopters.

During the month of July, the six scheduled carriers transported 810,062 (692,161) revenue passengers, which amounted to 88.1 (88.0) per cent of the total for Canadian carriers. Weight of revenue goods carried, at 9,970 (11,805) tons, accounted for 58.0 (65.3) per cent of the total for all Canadian carriers. Operating revenues totalled \$49,808,386 (\$44,441,340), or 83.2 (84.5) per cent of the total for all Canadian carriers. Operating expenses of \$40,424,646 (\$33,328,980) accounted for 86.7 (86.0) per cent of the total.

On international scheduled services, Canadian carriers transported 244,817 (225,280) passengers, or 30.2 (33.0) per cent of the total for all unit toll services of Canadian carriers. Passenger-miles on international scheduled services totalled 341,070,322 (295,265,526), amounting to 44.5 (45.3) per cent of unit toll passenger-miles. By area of service, the proportional breakdown of international passenger-miles is shown below.

Foreign carriers licensed to operate scheduled services in Canada transported 310,386 (125,751) revenue passengers, and 3,077 (1,821) tons of revenue goods into and out of Canada. Increases of 146.8 per cent and 69.0 per cent respectively were thus reported. It must be remembered, however, that a number of U.S. airlines were grounded by strikes for the latter half of July 1966.

Cumulative Data, Year-to-Date

During the first seven months of 1967, Canadian air carriers transported 4,978,314 (4,279,241) passengers or 16.3 per cent more than in the same period last year. The weight of revenue goods carried was up 4.4 per cent to 104,817 (100,408) tons. The number of revenue miles flown was 20.0 per cent higher at 90,329,810 (75,277,192). Operating revenues totalled \$300,609,412 (\$259,704,394), up 15.8 per cent, while expenses of \$290,264,605 (\$240,222,987) showed an increase of 20.8 per cent. The resultant operating income was \$10,344,807 (\$19,481,407) and the net income after taxes, \$3,059,343 (\$9,679,082).

Foreign carriers operating scheduled services in Canada transported 1,359,869 (851,149) revenue passengers and 18,871 (16,011) tons of revenue goods, showing increases of 59.8 and 17.9 per cent respectively for the first seven months of the year.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS(1)

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4).
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Classification of Canadian Carriers by Groups

Group I Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services, (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).

Group II Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd.(2).

Group III Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).

Group IV Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.

Group V Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.

Cargo:

Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).

Carrier, Air:

One authorized to operate aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class I) service.

Scheduled Carriers:

Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.

Express, Air:

A package service operated only within the U.S.A. and Canada; the rates cover door-to-door service. Because Air Express shipments take priority over Air Freight, they command higher rates.

Freedoms of the Air:

First Freedom: The privilege to fly over the territory of a foreign

country without landing.

Second Freedom: The privilege to land on the territory of a foreign

country for non-traffic purposes.

Third Freedom: The privilege to put down in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo taken on in the territory of the

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fourth Freedom: The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of the

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

Fifth Freedom: The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of any other foreign state and the privilege to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo coming from

any such territory.

Freight, Air: Articles carried on unit toll flights at standard per

pound rates or as bulk transportation.

Goods, Revenue: Air Cargo (freight and express) plus mail and excess

baggage.

Interline Traffic:

Domestic Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier at Canadian

points from other Canadian Air Carriers.

Foreign Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier from Foreign

Air Carriers.

Divisional Interline: Passengers and goods received from other operating

divisions of the same carrier.

International Services:

Transborder Services: Services between Canada and the United States, except Hawaii.

Southern Services: Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico, Central or South America.

Trans-Atlantic and

Polar Services: Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services: Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean

the Orient and Australasia.

Load Capacity Available: Load capacity available for the transportation of goods

and passengers after deduction of the operating load of

gas and oil, crew, stewards' supplies, etc.

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available Load Factor, Passenger:

seat-miles.

Load Factor, Weight: - See Weight Load Factor.

Miles: Statute miles of 5,280 ft.

Passenger: A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip.

For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as

two passengers.

Passenger Load-Factor: - See Load Factor, Passenger.

Passenger-Mile: The transportation of one passenger one mile.

Non-Revenue Passenger: A person, (including company personnel other than crew)

carried on a revenue transportation flight, for whom no

fare is collected.

Revenue Passenger: A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is

paid.

Seat-Miles Available: Seats available for the transportation of passengers

multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station

flight.

Specialty Flying Services: Non-transportation flying services, such as flying

training, aerial photography, and aerial inspection.

Short tons of 2,000 lbs. Tons:

Ton-Mile: The transportation of one ton of goods one mile or any

combination of weight in pounds and number of miles flown

the product of which is 2,000.

Ton-Miles Available: Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on each

inter-station flight.

Unit Toll Transportation: Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll

per unit. It includes:

(i) the scheduled services, which provide public trans-

portation between designated points in accordance

with a schedule (Class I); and

(ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on

a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a de-

fined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Weight Load - Factor: Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-

miles.

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
