INTRODUCTION

"Civil Aviation" reports are prepared from monthly and quarterly schedules filed with the Air Transport Committee, Canadian Transport Commission and the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Canadian commercial air carriers, and from monthly returns filed with the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by reporting foreign carriers.


For reporting purposes, Canadian air carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described on the first page of "Civil Aviation Definitions" to be found from page twenty to page twenty-two of this publication. In January 1968, 2 former Group III carriers were transferred to Group IV, and this, coupled with the transfer of carriers between Groups IV & V, has increased the number of reporting Group IV carriers by a total of 9. It should also be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Committee, is included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V is comprised of small air carriers required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from the other carrier statistics appearing throughout the report.


Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. The table contains the operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each.

Operations of those foreign carriers having scheduled services into and out of Canada are shown. Bulk transport data is therefore incomplete, since charter services by foreign carriers not otherwise operating in Canada are excluded. Foreign carriers report only hours and miles flown over Canadian territory. Statistics concerning passengers and goods in transit through Canada have been excluded.





REVIEW OF OCTOBER OPERATIONS

CANADIAN CARRIERS GROUPS I-IV AND FOREIGN CARRIERS

(October 1967 figures in brackets)

October operations of Canadian carriers showed decreased passenger activity but increased cargo activity compared to October 1967 operations. The number of revenue passengers carried decreased by 3.2 per cent to 780,692 (806,281) while the weight of goods carried increased by 29.7 per cent to 20,646 (15,916) tons. Revenue passenger-miles decreased by 2.6 per cent to 633,867,043 (650,787,583) while the number of goods ton-miles increased by 37.1 per cent to 21,596,061 (15,748,626). The number of revenue miles flown increased by 8.2 per cent to 15,354,134 (14,191,082).

Operating revenues for October 1968 were up by 6.8 per cent to \$51,193,987 (\$47,947,084) but operating expenses increased by 13.0 per cent to \$49,902,238 (\$44,177,942). As a result, operating income for the month declined to \$1,291,749 (\$3,769,142) and net income after taxes was a deficit figure of \$830,813 compared to an income in October 1967 of \$1,501,594.

The twenty (16) carriers operating helicopters exclusively flew 10,204 (9,276) revenue hours using 239 (214) helicopters. Their operating revenues totalled \$1,584,957 (\$1,424,969) while operating expenses amounted to \$1,682,165 (\$1,370,486). Thirteen (11) carriers operating fixed-wing aircraft as well as helicopters reported 1,469 (1,525) revenue hours using 38 (42) helicopters.

The six scheduled carriers transported 701,638 (735,904) revenue passengers or 89.9 (91.3) per cent of the total for all Canadian carriers. These six carriers transported 13,630 (10,595) tons of revenue goods or 66.0 (66.6) per cent of the total. Reported operating revenues for the scheduled carriers amounted to \$44,949,052 (\$42,387,232) or 87.8 (88.4) per cent of revenues for all carriers. Operating expenses amounted to \$42,844,525 (\$39,178,436) or 85.9 (88.7) per cent of the total for all carriers.

Canadian carriers providing international unit toll services during the month transported 182,115 (204,988) revenue passengers over 261,765,067 (264,468,577) passenger-miles. These operations accounted for 29.2 (30.9) per cent of the number of revenue passengers carried and 46.0 (44.1) per cent of the passenger-miles reported for all unit toll services. By area of service the proportional breakdown of international passenger-miles was as follows:

Foreign carriers licensed to operate scheduled services in Canada transported 227,813 (273,523) revenue passengers, a decrease of 16.7 per cent from October 1967 and 4,720 (2,986) tons of revenue goods, an increase of 53.4 per cent.

Cumulative Data, Year-to-Date

During the first ten months of 1968 Canadian air carriers transported 7,912,342 (7,692,463) passengers or 2.9 per cent more than in the same period of 1967. Weight of revenue goods carried was up 21.0 per cent to 187,160 (154,663) tons. In carrying this additional traffic carriers flew 154,563,854 (137,872,511) revenue miles or 12.1 per cent more than in the same period of 1967. Operating revenues for the year-to-date increased by 11.4 per cent to \$520,395,925 (\$467,336,048) while operating expenses were up 13.0 per cent to \$483,833,776 (\$427,987,889). As a result, operating income decreased to \$36,562,149 (\$39,348,159) and net income after taxes fell to \$14,113,285 (\$20,587,764).

Foreign carriers operating scheduled services in Canada transported 2,196,085 (2,321,975) revenue passengers, a decrease of 5.4 per cent, and 35,725 (27,751) tons of revenue goods, an increase of 28.7 per cent over the first ten months of 1967.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS(1)

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4).
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Classification of Canadian Carriers by Groups

Group I Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services, (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).

Group II Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd.(2).

Group III Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).

Group IV Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.

Group V Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.

Cargo:

Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).

Carrier, Air:

One authorized to operate aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class I) service.

Scheduled Carriers:

Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.

Express, Air:

A package service operated only within the U.S.A. and Canada; the rates cover door-to-door service. Because Air Express shipments take priority over Air Freight, they command higher rates.

III carriers.

A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip. For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.

Passenger Load-Factor:

- See Load Factor, Passenger.

Passenger-Mile:

The transportation of one passenger one mile.

Non-Revenue Passenger:

A person, (including company personnel other than crew) carried on a revenue transportation flight, for whom no fare is collected.

Revenue Passenger:

A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is paid.

Seat-Miles Available:

Seats available for the transportation of passengers multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station flight.

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, and aerial inspection.

Tons:

Short tons of 2,000 lbs.

Ton-Mile:

The transportation of one ton of goods one mile or any combination of weight in pounds and number of miles flown the product of which is 2,000.

Ton-Miles Available:

Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on each inter-station flight.

Unit Toll Transportation:

Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- (i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule (Class I); and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Weight Load - Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.



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
