Civil Aviation - April 1969 Scheduled Carrier Operations

Figures for the April 1969 operations of the six major Canadian airlines are peculiar when compared to statistics of a year earlier. A strike by Air Canada employees caused operations of that carrier to cease April 20. Although CP Air, the regional carriers and smaller local airlines immediately began offering service over Air Canada's routes traffic and revenue totals were reduced from normal figures for the month.

CP Air and the four regional carriers reported substantially increased traffic and revenues for the month but totals for the six carriers were not as large as normal because of the sharp decline in Air Canada's traffic.

It should be noted however, that on a year-to-date basis the Total Operating Income for the six carriers was \$10 million more than in the same period last year.
