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
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

INTRODUCTION

This report presents a summary of monthly statements filed by Canadian Air Carriers and foreign air carriers licensed to operate in Canada. A more comprehensive annual report based on audited yearly statements will be published later under the title "Civil Aviation 1960". Data shown in this report are subject to revision.

In 1960, Canadian air carriers have been classified on the basis of gross annual flying revenues for the first time. The five groups of carriers which compose the new classification are defined in the last two pages of this publication along with definitions of civil aviation terminology. It should be noted, however, that Nordair Ltd. and Wheeler Air Lines Ltd., which were classified as Group II carriers by the Air Transport Board, have been included with Group III carriers in this report for statistical purposes.

Data for the Group V carriers which were mainly classified as Class C or Class D carriers previously are presented in tables 10 and 11 only. All other tables exclude the operations of this class of carrier. As a result, the number of reporting carriers shown in table 1 for 1960 is considerably below the corresponding total for 1959. In comparing industry totals for the two years, however, the exclusion of the Group V carriers is relatively insignificant as operating revenues of this class of carrier accounted for only 2.7 per cent of the total operating revenues of the industry in 1960.

The number of revenue passengers transported by Canadian air carriers amounted to 4,726,849 in 1960 as compared with 4,681,264 in 1959 and the volume of revenue goods aggregated 237,986,139 lbs. as against 235,883,141 lbs. In percentage terms, there was an increase of one per cent for both passengers and goods. Revenue miles flown, however, were down 2 per cent to 104,010,423 from 106,107,103. Operating revenues increased 7.7 per cent to \$237,429,895 from \$220,423,558 and operating expenses rose 9 per cent to \$239,205,991 from \$219,487,993. As a result, the operating deficit of \$1,776,096 was substantially greater than the deficit of \$935,565 reported for 1959. The deficit, after provision for income taxes, amounted to \$6,098,635 as compared with \$2,484,178 in the previous year, due mainly to an increase in interest expense which rose to \$9,173,831 from \$4,474,048.

In 1960, 89.2 per cent of all revenue passengers and 48.2 per cent of all revenue goods were carried on unit toll service. Corresponding figures for 1959 were 89.2 per cent and 46.4 per cent, respectively. It should be noted that a complete breakdown of unit toll services into scheduled and non-scheduled services is not possible since some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases, the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Data for companies operating helicopters only are shown in table 8. These companies operate approximately 75 per cent of all helicopters in Canada. They reported, in 1960, an operating income of \$521,778 as compared with an operating income of \$571,767 for 1959.

Foreign carriers transported 724,301 revenue passengers and 16,706,880 lbs. of revenue goods in 1960 as against 634,737 passengers and 14,066,974 lbs. of goods in 1959. This represented an increase of 14.1 per cent in the number of passengers and 18.8 per cent in the volume of goods. As in the past, foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- the scheduled services, which provide transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule; and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points.

Bulk Transportation:

Transportation of passengers or goods at a toll per mile or per hour for the entire aircraft (charter), or in accordance with a specific contract.

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising.

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating some unit toll scheduled service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any unit toll scheduled service.

Revenue Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled service plus two major transport carriers: Nordair Ltd. and Wheeler Air Lines Ltd.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Groups I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000, and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air Cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Passenger Load Factors:

Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to availa-

ble seat-miles.

Weight Load Factor:

Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available

ton-miles.

Interline Traffic:

Passengers and goods received by a carrier either from foreign carriers (foreign interline) or from other Canadian carriers (domestic interline) or from

other operating divisions of the same carrier

(division interline).

International Services:

Trans Border Services:

Services between Canada and the United States.

Southern Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean,

Mexico or South America.

Trans Atlantic and Polar

Services:

Services between Canada and Europe.

Pacific and Orient

Services:

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific

Ocean or the Orient.

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
