





INTRODUCTION

This report presents a summary of monthly statements filed by Canadian and foreign air carriers licensed to operate in Canada. A more comprehensive annual report based on audited yearly statements will be published later under the title "Civil Aviation 1962". Data shown in this report are subject to revision.

For reporting purposes, Canadian carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. These groups are described in the last two pages of this publication along with definitions of civil aviation terminology. It should be noted, however, that Nordair Ltd. and Eastern Provincial Airways Ltd., which are classified as Group II carriers by the Air Transport Board have been included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V comprises the small carriers which are required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from industry totals appearing throughout the report.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except number 6, which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for three Canadian carriers operating international unit toll services: Canadian Pacific Airlines, Trans-Canada Air Lines and Transair Ltd. Statistics on revenue passengers, cargo and mail transported are now being included in this table.

Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. However, a complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. In such cases the route is assigned to the class of service which predominates.

Table 9 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis; also separate totals for Canadian and foreign carriers. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded.

Statistics on aircraft owned and leased by Canadian carriers are presented in Table 12 for each group of carriers, by category of aircraft and weight group.

Review of operations:

In 1962, Canadian air carriers transported 5,268,799 passengers compared with 4,950,897 the previous year, an increase of 16 per cent, while the revenue goods rose to 236,561,782 lbs. from 228,-077,376 lbs., an increase of 3.7 per cent. Revenue miles flown were up 1.8 per cent to 99,314,204 from 97,577,514. Operating revenues for 1962 totalled \$284,443,403 compared with \$254,873,901 for 1961, an increase of 11.6 per cent and operating expenses rose to \$277,076,521 from \$257,445,532, an increase of 7.6 per cent. As a result the Canadian air carriers showed an operating income of \$7,366,882 compared with a deficit of \$2,571,631 for the previous year. However after provision for income taxes and other charges were deducted there was an operating deficit of \$4,520,384 which was 65.6 per cent lower than the figure of \$13,146,423 for the year 1961.

The six scheduled carriers transported 4,695,464 revenue passengers or 89.1 per cent of the total carried by Canadian airlines, and 142,192,333 lbs. of revenue goods or 56.9 per cent of the total for the year under review. During 1961 these same carriers transported 90 per cent of the revenue passengers and 55.1 per cent of the revenue goods. The scheduled carriers also accounted for 87.8 per cent of all operating revenues and 87.9 per cent of the operating expenses.

Data for companies flying helicopters only are shown in Table 8. These companies operate approximately 70 per cent of all commercial helicopters in Canada. During 1962 they flew a total of 49,087 revenue hours and reported operating revenues of \$6,713,045 while operating expenses amounted to \$6,343,538. The resulting net income after income taxes of \$283,401 compares with that of \$280,586 reported in 1961.

The Group V carriers transported 154,323 revenue passengers and 10,127,198 lbs. of revenue goods for the year 1962 compared with 151,498 passengers and 10,397,821 lbs. of goods during 1961. The operating revenues for this group totalled \$7,238,023 and operating expenses amounted to \$7,407,349 compared to \$8,770,977 and \$8,819,055 respectively for 1961.

The number of passengers carried by foreign carriers during 1962 remained practically the same while the volume of revenue goods rose 6.9 per cent, the revenue passengers totalling 795,375 (789,680 in 1962) and revenue goods 23,505,980 lbs. (21,991,694 lbs.). It should be noted that foreign carriers are required to report hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only and passengers and goods in transit are excluded.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS

Unit Toll Transportation:

Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes:

- (i) the scheduled services, which provide public transportation between designated points in accordance with a schedule (Class 1); and
- (ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Specialty Flying Services:

Non-transportation flying services, such as flying training, aerial photography, aerial pest control and aerial advertising (Class 7).

Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers operating a scheduled (Class 1) service.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class 1) service.

Classification of Canadian Carriers:

Group I Carriers:

Trans-Canada Air Lines and Canadian Pacific Air Lines.

Group II Carriers:

All other carriers licensed to perform scheduled (Class 1) service plus one major transport carrier: Nordair Ltd.

Group III Carriers:

All carriers with gross annual flying revenues of \$400,000 and over which are not included in Group I and II.

Group IV Carriers:

All carriers having gross annual flying revenues of \$60,000 and over but less than \$400,000 and, in addition, any carrier licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues under \$60,000.

Group V Carriers:

All carriers other than those licensed to perform unit toll service with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$60,000.

Passenger:

A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip. For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger and a round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.

Revenue Passenger:

A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is paid.

Non-Revenue Passenger:

A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation flight for whom no fare is collected, including company personnel.

Air Cargo:

Air freight and air express.

Goods:

Air cargo plus excess baggage and air mail.

Tons:
