INTRODUCTION

This report presents a summary of monthly statements filed by Canadian and Foreign air carriers licensed to operate in Canada. A more comprehensive annual report based on audited yearly statements will be published later under the title "Civil Aviation 1966". Data shown in this report are subject to revision.

For reporting purposes, Canadian carriers are classified into five groups on the basis of gross annual flying revenues and type of service performed. See page 20 for a more detailed description. It should be noted that Nordair Ltd., classified as a Group II carrier by the Air Transport Board, has been included with Group III carriers for statistical purposes. Group V is comprised of the small carriers which are required to file returns on a quarterly basis only. Data on their operations are excluded from industry totals appearing throughout this report. In 1966 the financial statement will appear in the Annual only.

Whenever feasible the unit toll services are broken down into scheduled and non-scheduled. A complete breakdown is not possible as some carriers offer both services on specific routes. Routes have been re-allocated in accordance with revised licenses and schedules, and are assigned to the predominant class of service.

Effective August 1, 1966 reporting classifications for specialty flying services were revised. In tables 8 and 11, data shown for both 1965 and 1966 are according to the revised classification.

Domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are combined in all tables except Table 6 which provides a breakdown of domestic and international operations for Canadian carriers operating international unit toll and bulk services.

Operations of those foreign carriers having scheduled services into Canada are shown. Bulk transport data is therefore incomplete, since charter services by foreign carriers not otherwise operating in Canada are excluded. Foreign carriers report only hours and miles flown over Canadian territory. Passengers and goods in transit are excluded from this report.

Table 7 provides data on traffic leaving and entering Canada on an area of service basis. Passengers, cargo and mail in transit through Canada are excluded. The table contains operations of both Canadian and Foreign carriers with separate totals for each group.

Air Carriers, 1966 Operations*

For Canadian air carriers, 1966 was on the whole a year of substantial growth. Number of revenue passengers carried increased 13.6 per cent to 7,461,687 (6,570,449) while weight of goods carried was up 16.6 per cent to 178,550 (153,196) tons. Revenue miles flown were 15.2 per cent higher at 135,058,795 (117,237,963). For transportation services, totals of 6,000,212,-600 (5,196,130,630) revenue passenger-miles and 149,166,149 (123,507,619) revenue goods ton-miles were reported, showing increases of 15.5 per cent and 20.8 per cent respectively.

Operating revenues of Canadian carriers for the year totalled \$460,556,463 (\$393,623,066), an increase of 17.0 per cent, while operating expenses amounted to \$429,795,272 (\$368,223,425), up 16.7 per cent. Operating income for the year was thus \$30,761,191 (\$25,399,641) or 21.1 per cent higher, while net income after taxes was \$15,710,997 (\$13,508,885) or 16.3 per cent above that for 1965.

During the year, the 17 (16) carriers operating helicopters exclusively reported flying 113,848 (93,599) revenue hours using 208 (178) helicopters. Their operating revenues totalled \$14,702,053 (\$11,724,261) and their operating expenses were \$12,874,321 (\$10,365,442), showing increases amounting to 25.4 per cent and 24.2 per cent respectively. Ten (6) carriers operating helicopters as well as fixed wing aircraft reported flying 15,191 (14,064) revenue hours with 35 (25) helicopters. In total, hours flown by helicopters were up 19.9 per cent to 129,039 (107,663).

The six scheduled carriers maintained about the same position relative to all Canadian carriers. They transported 6,754,438 (5,954,952) revenue passengers, or 90.5 (90.6) of the total, and 123,860 (106,245) tons of revenue goods, or 69.4 per cent of total in both years. Their operating revenues were \$403,049,847 (\$348,246,849), or 87.5 (88.5) per cent of the total, while their operating expenses, at \$378,175,342 (\$327,012,498) were 88.0 (88.8) per cent of the total. Their net income after taxes, totalled \$11,258,389 (\$10,354,729) or 71.7 (76.7) per cent of the Canadian carriers total.

The Group V carriers transported 224,607 (223,132) revenue passengers and 8,135 (12,124) tons of goods, an increase of 0.07 per cent and a decrease of 32.9 per cent respectively. Revenue hours flown were up 23.8 per cent to 374,589 (302,454).

Foreign carriers having scheduled services to and from Canada reported transportation of 1,562,004 (1,268,090) revenue passengers and 28,577 (19,892) tons of revenue goods, up 23.2 per cent and 43.7 per cent respectively.

CIVIL AVIATION DEFINITIONS(1)

Bulk Transportation:

- (1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a toll per mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4); and
- (2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific contracts (Class 5).

Classification of Canadian __Carriers_by_Groups

Group I Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services. (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).

Group II Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd.(2).

Group III Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).

Group IV Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.

Group V Carriers:

Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform non-scheduled services with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.

Cargo:

Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).

Carrier, Air:

Any person who operates aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.

Non-Scheduled Carriers:

Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class I) service.

Scheduled Carriers:

Air Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.

Express, Air:

It is a package service operated within the U.S.A. and Canada only; the rates cover door-to-door service. Because Air Express shipments are carried on all flights and take priority over Air Freight and because Express shipments receive priority on the ground too, they take higher rates.

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-Fourth Freedom:

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of the

state whose nationality the aircraft possesses.

The privilege to take on in a foreign country, passen-Fifth Freedom:

gers, mail and cargo destined for the territory of any other foreign state and the privilege to put down in a foreign country, passengers, mail and cargo coming from

any such territory.

Articles carried on regular flights at standard per pound Freight, Air:

rates when space is available.

Air Cargo (freight and express) plus mail and excess Goods:

baggage.

Interline Traffic:

Domestic Interline: Passengers and goods received by a carrier at Canadian

points from other Canadian Air Carriers.

Passengers and goods received by a carrier from Foreign Foreign Interline:

Air Carriers.

Passengers and goods received from other operating Divisional Interline:

divisions of the same carrier.

International Services:

Services between Canada and the United States. Trans-Border Services:

Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Southern Services:

Mexico, Central or South America.

Trans-Atlantic and

Services between Canada and Europe. Polar Services:

Pacific and Orient

Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean Services:

or the Orient.

Load capacity available for the transportation of goods Load Capacity Available:

and passengers after deduction of the operating load of

gas and oil, crew, stewards' supplies, etc.

Load Factor, Passenger: Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available

seat-miles.

Load Factor, Weight: - See Weight, Load-Factor.

Miles: Statute miles of 5,280 ft.

Passenger: A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip.

For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as

two passengers.

Passenger Load-Factor: - See Load Factor, Passenger.

Passenger-Mile: The transportation of one passenger one mile.

Non-Revenue Passenger: A child or adult carried on a revenue transportation

flight for whom no fare is collected, including company

personnel.

Revenue Passenger: A child or adult for which a fare or part of a fare is

paid.

Seat-Miles Available: Seats available for the transportation of passengers

multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station

flight.

Specialty Flying Services: Non-transportation flying services, such as flying

training, aerial photography, aerial application and distribution, and aerial inspection, reconnaissance and

advertising.

Tons: Short tons of 2,000 lbs.

Ton-Mile: The transportation of one ton of goods one mile.

Ton-Miles Available: Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on

each inter-station flight.

Unit Toll Transportation: Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll

per unit. It includes:

(i) the scheduled services, which provide public trans-

portation between designated points in accordance


with a schedule (Class I); and

(ii) the non-scheduled services, which provide public transportation either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity

(Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).

Weight Load Factor: Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-

miles.
