

Canadian air carriers reported continuing growth and progress in 1953 as new records were established for most of the financial accounts and operational items, but, as in 1952, higher operating costs resulted in a drop in operating income to \$1,295,600 from \$3,763,948 and in net income to \$1,120,441 from \$1,372,385.

All revenue and expense accounts, except the cost of general taxes, showed substantial gains over the previous year, and reached new levels. Revenue received for the transportation of passengers rose to \$59,566,012 a gain of \$7,884,313 or 15.3 per cent over the 1952 total of \$51,681,699, mail revenue increased to \$10,089,106 from \$9,830,719; freight revenue rose to \$5,362,991 from \$4.889.663 and excess baggage receipts were up to \$622,609 from \$480,739. Total revenue for the performance of unit toll transportation services thus amounted to \$75,640,718 as compared with \$66,882,820 in 1952, an increase of \$8,757,898 or 13.1 per cent. Bulk transportation services earned \$19,664,102 an advance of \$2,712,065 or 16 per cent over 1952 and other flying services totalled \$5,716,720 as against \$4,298,355, the addition of \$3,233,960 received for non-flying services, up from \$2,386,083 in 1952 raised the total operating revenues to \$104,255,500 from \$90,519,295, an advance of \$13,736,205 or 15.2 per cent, total operating revenues of the scheduled carriers rose to \$84,197,975 from \$75,115,634 or by 12.1 per cent while those for the non-scheduled airlines rose 30.2 per cent to \$20,057,525.

Operating expenses on the whole rose more rapidly than operating revenues. Aircraft operation and maintenance expenses advanced 18.6 per cent to \$60,618,261 from \$51,099,026; ground operation and maintenance costs increased 19.9 per cent to \$25,186,828 from \$21,002,448; traffic costs rose to \$10,539,641 from \$8,597,499; and, general administration charges increased to \$6,192,683 from \$5,619,172; while general taxes declined slightly. The total operating expenses thus amounted to \$102,959,900 as compared with \$86,755,347 in the previous year, a gain of \$16,204,553 or 18.7 per cent.

The above mentioned increases in the financial accounts were, as a rule, the result of the advancement to record breaking levels of all reported traffic data, except for the amount of non-revenue goods carried. The number of passengers carried in unit toll transportation services increased to 1,822,748 from 1,591,239, a gain of 231,509 or 14.5 per cent while the number of revenue passenger miles rose 17 per cent to 895,597,913 miles from 765,354,996, thus indicating a longer average journey. In addition, there were 61,406 non revenue passengers carried and 388,989 transported in bulk (charter or contract) services. The total number of passengers


thus numbered 2,273,143 as compared with 1,952,316 in 1952. The volume of revenue goods flown by air aggregated 168,357,031 lbs. of which 35,627,336 lbs. were carried in unit toll services and 132,729,695 lbs, in bulk transportation services. In the previous year, Canadian carriers transported 127, 291, 124 lbs. of which 32,583,315 lbs. were toled in unit toll flights and 94,707,809 lbs. in bulk services. The increase in revenue goods carried in unit toll transportation amounted to 3,044,021 lbs. or 9.3 per cent while the corresponding goods ton miles rose 15.7 per cent to 10,728,780 from 9,272,667. Another new record was established for the volume of air mail which advanced to 17,085,482 lbs. and exceeded the previous record of 15,321,529 lbs. which was set in 1952, by 11.5 per cent. Mail ton miles rose to 6,307,456 from 5,558,662 an improvement of 13.5 per cent.


During the year, Canadian carriers flew a total of 61,799,290 revenue miles in 487,743 hours of which 40,883,420 miles were in unit toll transportation services requiring a flying time of 231,511 hours, and 20,915,870 miles in bulk services flown in 173,039 hours. In 1952, the airlines logged 56,752,397 revenue miles in 459,320 hours of which 37,500,780 miles in 218,442 hours were in unit toll services and 19,251,617 miles in 160,611 hours in bulk services.


Salaries and wages received by the 10,703 employees engaged by Canadian carriers amounted to \$42,188,464 for the year as compared with 9,398 employees who earned \$35,404,009 in 1952. The average salary was thus raised to \$3,942 from \$3,767, a gain of \$175 or 4.6 per cent. All classes of employees increased in number and most of them in average earnings.

Gasoline consumed by Canadian carriers, which amounted to 38,885,158 gallons in 1952, rose to 44,817,925 gallons, a rise of 15.3 per cent while the cost which was \$12,498,175 a year ago advanced 20 per cent to \$15,002,452. The industry also consumed 592,859 gallons of oil at a cost of \$583,943 as compared with 484,222 gallons costing \$490,258 in 1952. The average cost per gallon, to Canadian carriers for gasoline thus rose from 32.1 to 33.5 cents but that for oil declined from 101.2 per gallon to 98.5 cents.

Accidents involving Canadian carriers during 1953 totalled 174 as compared with 169 in 1952, 137 in 1951 and 148 in 1950 according to the report issued by the Civil Aviation Division, Department of Transport. Fatalities numbered 74 as against 57 in 1952, 109 in 1951 and 99 in 1950. The number of passengers killed increased to 43 from 26 in the previous year while 25 pilots lost their lives against 28 in 1952.








