CIVIL AVIATION 1955

Canadian air carriers completed a very successful year in 1955, reporting an operating income of \$6,084,204, more than three times the income of \$1,876,920 reported in 1954. The six scheduled airlines accounted for 48.1 per cent of this increase. Net income after taxes amounted to \$4,132,752 compared with \$849,647 in the previous year.

With all revenue accounts showing significant increases, the total operating revenue for the year under review reached a new high of \$152,739,018 compared with \$108,864,289 one year ago, an increase of \$43,874,729 or 40.3 per cent. Revenue received from the transportation of passengers advanced to \$77,598,119 from \$66,748,505, a gain of \$10,849,614 or 16.3 per cent and continued to be the principal source of income. Mail receipts rose to \$10,904,729 from \$10,873,163, freight earnings jumped to \$7,951,670 from \$5,979,693, and excess baggage accounted for revenue of \$863,494 as against \$726,037 last year. Total unit toll transportation revenues thus advanced to \$97,318,012 from \$84,327,398, an increase of \$12,990.614 or 15.4 per cent. Bulk transportation services earned \$44,543,258, nearly three times the \$15,149,492 earned in 1954. Other flying services produced \$6,722,032 as against \$5,984,893 while non-flying services totalled \$4,155,716 compared with \$3,402,506 in the previous year.

Operating expenses for the year were considerably higher in 1955 than in the previous year, due to a large extent to the continuing growth of air service in Canada. Aircraft operation and maintenance expenses rose to \$90,504,604 from \$59,984,323; ground operations and maintenance required \$32,909,216 against \$27,840,216; traffic charges were up to \$13,898,252 from \$11,806,206 and general administration costs rose to \$8,723,804 from \$6,824,333. General taxes at \$618,938 from \$532,291 raised total operating expenses to \$146,654,814 from \$106,987,369, an increase of \$39,667,445 or 37.1 per cent.

The increased volume of traffic carried during the year 1955, both passenger and freight, is a good indication of the continued growth of civil aviation in Canada with all types of traffic, except nonrevenue passengers, reaching new record breaking levels. Total passengers transported in unit toll transportation services numbered 2,311,115 as against 1,986,099 a year ago, a gain of 325,016 or 16.4 per cent, while the number of revenue passenger miles increased by 14.9 per cent, to 1,175,343,729 from 1,023,134,596. An additional 406,222 persons were flown in bulk transportation services and 45.407 non-revenue passengers were carried, bringing the total number of passengers transported by Canadian carriers to 2,762,744 as compared with 2,381,775 in 1954.

Canadian air carriers handled a total of 225,294,647 lbs. of revenue goods in 1955, more than twice the total of 103,174,610 lbs. transported

in 1954. This large increase was due mainly to the tremendous jump in the amount of goods carried in bulk transportation services, which amounted to 175,788,626 lbs. compared with 63,140,902 lbs. one year ago, while an additional 49,506,021 lbs. were flown in unit toll services as against 40,003,708 lbs. in 1954. The increase in the amount of goods handled in bulk transportation services was largely a result of the volume of goods transported by air for defence projects in the Canadian northland.

Again this year a new record high was established for the volume of air mail carried by Canadian carriers which climbed to 24,267,437 lbs., exceeding last year's record of 22,161,523 lbs. by 2,105,914 lbs. or 9.5 per cent. Mail ton miles rose to 8,937,435 from 8,138,079, an increase of 9.8 per cent.


Transportation statistics for all services include foreign carriers in both trans-border service and Atlantic and Pacific services. During the year under review these carriers transported 540,431 passengers, 8,838,655 lbs. of goods and 2,349,068 lbs. of mail. The mileage shown for these foreign carriers represents miles flown over Canadian territory only.


During the year, Canadian carriers flew a total of 48,593,351 miles in revenue unit toll transportation, requiring a flying time of 261,424 miles and 238,121 hours. Bulk transportation services accounted for an additional 32,266,480 miles and 254,880 hours, up considerably from the 16,755,073 miles and 147,501 hours flown in this class of service one year ago.


A total of \$55,520,899 was earned in salaries and wages by 13,271 employees engaged in the industry in 1955 compared with total earnings of \$47,171,414 and 11,690 employees in 1954. Thus the average salary rose to \$4,184 from \$4,035, a gain of 3.7 per cent. All classes of personnel increased in number and in salary.

An average fleet of 768 planes was used by Canadian commercial air carriers during the year, an increase of 20 from the 1954 fleet of 748. The operation of this fleet of aircraft required a total of 65,422,771 gallons of gasoline and 902,445 gallons of oil, the cost of which amounted to \$22,004,244 and \$896,667, respectively. During 1954 a total of 46,411,787 gallons of gasoline and 632,122 gallons of oil were consumed at a cost of \$15,611,647 for gasoline and \$633,453 for oil.

A total of 63 lives were lost in 1955 as a result of 264 accidents involving Canadian carriers, according to a report issued by the Civil Aviation Division, Department of Transport. In 1954 there were 201 accidents and 70 fatalities. During the year under review 24 passengers and 34 pilots lost their lives, compared with 47 passengers and 18 pilots in the previous year.








