

The Canadian air transport industry registered further impressive advances in 1956 but at rates generally below those prevailing in 1955. Operating income for all carriers rose to a record-breaking \$7,586,870, surpassing the previous high of \$6,990,586 in 1951 as well as last year's total of \$6,084,204. This year's gain of 24.7 p.c. was associated with fairly consistent increases in all categories of revenue whereas the previous year's rise of close to 200 p.c. was due mainly to rapid expansion in bulk transportation services, largely in connection with defence projects in the Canadian northland. A further interesting feature of this year's increase was the substantial improvement in operating income of scheduled as opposed to nonscheduled airlines. Operating income of scheduled airlines rose to \$5,611,928 from \$3,678,688 while for non-scheduled airlines it dropped to \$1,974,942 from \$2,405,516.

Total operating revenue for all Canadian carriers established a new record in 1956, at \$182,168,850 some 19.3 p.c. above the previous high of \$152,739.018 recorded in 1955. Revenue from passenger fares continued to be the principal source income advancing to \$96,180,546 from \$77,598,119, an increase of \$18,582,427 or 23,9 p.c. Mail receipts rose to \$11,532,851 from \$10,904,729, earnings from goods carried in unit toll service to \$9,145,688 from \$7,951,670 and excess baggage charges to \$1,150,999 from \$863,494. As a result, total revenues in unit toll service rose 21.3 p.c. to \$118,010,084 from \$97,318,012. Revenue from both passengers and freight in bulk or chartered service amounted to \$53,435,589 compared with \$44,543,258 in 1955, an increase of 20 p.c. Other flying services produced revenues of \$7,124,088 as against \$6,722,032 and non-flying services, \$3,599,089 versus \$4,155,716.

Operating expenses were also substantially higher in 1956 amounting in total to \$174,581,980 as compared with \$146,654,814 in 1955, an increase of \$27,927,166 or 19.0 p.c. Aircraft operation and maintenance costs rose to \$108,268,728 from \$90,504,604, ground operation and maintenance costs to \$39,014,039 from \$32,909,216, traffic expenses to \$16,149,865 from \$13,898,252 and general taxes to \$772,015 from \$618,938.

A total of 3,320,705 revenue passengers were carried during 1956 as compared with 2,717,337 in the previous year, an increase of 603,368 or 22.2 p.c. Revenue unit toll passengers numbered 2,796,841 compared with 2,311,115 while revenue unit toll passenger miles increased by 26.0 p.c. to 1,480,639,773 from 1,175,343,729. An additional 523,864 persons were flown in bulk or charter service as compared with 406,222 during 1955.

Revenue goods transported by air aggregated 310,003,135 lb. of which 63,117,432 lb. were carried in unit toll services and 246,885,703 lb. in bulk or charter service. Goods carried in unit toll services consisted of 43,781,833 lb. of freight, 14,594,643 lb. of express and 4,740,956 lb. of excess baggage; freight was the only type of cargo flown in charter service. A new all-time high was established for the volume of mail transported which at 25,570,279 lb. exceeded last year's record of 24,267,437 lb. by 5.4 p.c.


Transportation statistics for all services include foreign carriers in both trans-border and Atlantic and Pacific services. During 1956 these carriers transported 553,572 passengers, 9,942,801 lb. of freight and 2,344,007 lb. of mail. Comparable figures for the previous year are 540,431 passengers, 8,838,655 lb. of freight and 2,349,068 lb. of mail. The mileage shown for these foreign carriers represents miles flown over Canadian territory only.


During 1956, Canadian carriers flew a total of 56,067,785 miles in revenue unit toll transportation, requiring 288,120 hours of flying time. This compares with 48,593,351 miles and 261,424 hours in 1955. An additional 42,369,709 miles were flown in 343,316 hours in the performance of bulk or charter services, a considerable increase from the 32,266,480 miles and 254,880 hours flown in this class of service one year ago.


Salaries and wages for the 14,848 employees engaged in the industry totalled \$65,240,831 for the year compared with 13,271 employees earning \$55,520,899 in 1955. The average annual salary rose to \$4,394 from \$4,184, a gain of 5.0 p.c. All classes of personnel with the exception of co-pilots showed increases in number and salary.

An average fleet of 825 planes was used by Canadian commercial air carriers in 1956, an increase of 57 over the 1955 fleet of 768. The operation of this fleet of aircraft required a total of 83,430,347 gallons of gasoline and 1,002,674 gallons of oil at a cost of \$27,584,973 and \$1,053,188, respectively. During 1955 fuel requirements were 65,422,771 gallons of gasoline and 902,445 gallons of oil at a cost of \$22,004,244 for gasoline and \$896,667 for oil.

A total of 262 flying accidents involving Canadian carriers claimed 130 lives during 1956 according to the report issued by the Civil Aviation Division, Department of Transport. This compares with 264 accidents and 84 fatalities in 1955. During the year under review, 97 passengers and 26 pilots lost their lives as compared with 42 passengers and 40 pilots in 1955.










