



The figures presented in this publication cover the operating and financial data submitted by Canadian carriers and reporting foreign air carriers doing business within Canada or between Canada and other countries. Statistics of Canadian airlines include both their domestic and international flights while figures for foreign companies cover their hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only. Passengers and goods in transit through Canada are not included. Because the coverage given to Canadian airlines differs from that given to foreign airlines the statistics shown under similar headings are not directly comparable.

In this report, Canadian air carriers have been divided into five groups based on gross annual flying revenues and the type of service (scheduled or non-scheduled) performed. Definitions of these groups and of other terms used are given on the last two pages of the publication. The number of Canadian carriers which submitted annual reports for 1965 in each group is as follows:

The total number of air carriers reporting varies slightly from year to year, chiefly because of entries, withdrawals and amalgamations of small air carriers. Changes in the number of small firms are of little significance in the total figures for all categories but there can be significant changes within groups and from one group to another depending upon the activities of individual companies. These changes tend to produce distortions in comparisons of specific groups over a period of years.

Because Nordair Ltd. did not operate scheduled routes during 1965, it is included in Group III for statistical purposes, even though it is comparable in gross revenue to the carriers in Group II.

Since Group V carriers file reports on a quarterly basis only, data on their operations are not available for monthly publication but are shown in a special table in the monthly report for March, June, September and December. This Group V information is not included in totals for all carriers shown in other tables throughout the report. To be consistent with the monthly publications this practice has been continued in the annual report. Although they are by far the largest Group in terms of numbers, the Group V carriers are not significant in terms of revenue; their reported operating revenues usually amount to less than 4 per cent of the total operating revenues of all Canadian carriers.

Domestic operations are shown separately from international operations of Canadian carriers only in Table 5 which classifies certain statistics by area of service. In Tables 3 and 5, "Available ton-miles" and "Weight load factor" on scheduled services have been revised. Corrected figures for 1963 and 1964 are available on request.

Wherever it is practical to do so, figures for services sold on a unit toll basis are subdivided into scheduled operations and non-scheduled operations. However, a complete breakdown is not possible because some air carriers offer both types of service on the same route. In such cases the route is designated scheduled or non-scheduled according to the class of service which predominates.

Financial statistics of Canadian carriers which are shown in Tables 8 to 16 are collected and compiled according to definitions and procedures outlined in a set of manuals entitled "Uniform System of Accounts and Reports for Commercial Air Carriers".

Review of 1965 Operations

During the year under review, Canadian carriers transported 6,570,449 revenue passengers, showing an increase of 13.6 per cent over 1964, and of 39.0 per cent over 1960. Weight of revenue goods carried rose to 153,196 tons, or 13.3 per cent above 1964 and 28.7 per cent over 1960 levels. Revenue hours flown, at 781,774, were 18.2 per cent higher than in 1964, exceeding the 1959 peak of 764,229 for the first time. Number of revenue miles flown reached 117,237,963, an increase of 13.3 per cent over 1964, which at 103,451,614 was only 6.0 per cent above the 1961 low of 97,577,514.

Hours flown on unit toll services showed an increase of 11.5 per cent over 1964; increases of 21.4 per cent for hours on bulk services and 30.2 per cent for specialty flying hours were reported. Weight of cargo and excess baggage carried on unit toll services totalled 73,502 tons, up 25.1 per cent over 1964, while freight carried on bulk transportation services was 2.7 per cent higher at 54,474 tons. Mail carried was up 7.8 per cent in weight at 25,220 tons. Number of passengers carried on unit toll flights, at 5,939,267, showed an increase of 14.3 per cent, while bulk transportation services, with an increase of 8.0 per cent, added 631,182 to the total.

Revenue miles flown on unit toll services rose 13.0 per cent to 86,334,027, while passenger-miles, at 4,731,304,865, showed an increase of 20.1 per cent, and goods ton-miles, at 110,000,601 were up 25.0 per cent above 1964 levels.

The six scheduled carriers transported 13.5 per cent more passengers and 21.8 per cent more goods in terms of weight than in 1964. While their share of passengers carried shifted slightly to 90.6 per cent from 90.8 per cent, they accounted for 69.4 per cent of weight of goods carried, by Canadian carriers compared with 64.5 per cent in 1964. In 1965 the scheduled carriers transported 5,954.952 passengers and 106,245 tons of goods: in 1964 they reported carrying 5,248,038 passengers and 87,207 tons of goods.

During 1965, Foreign airlines licensed to operate in Canada carried into and out of this country a total of 1,268,090 revenue passengers and 19,892 tons of revenue goods, indicating increases of 27.5 per cent and 28.1 per cent respectively over the 1964 totals of 994,653 passengers and 15,534 tons.

Operating revenues and expenses of Canadian carriers showed almost parallel growth as they climbed to record heights. Revenues increased by 17.3 per cent to \$392,806.566 while expenses rose by 16.7 per cent to \$368,207,884. The resultant operating income of \$24,598,682 was 12.7 per cent higher than the 1964 figure. Net profit after taxes was \$13,181,834, or 57.1 per cent higher than in 1964.

At year-end, total assets of Canadian carriers were valued at \$397,446,353 or \$26,381,513 higher than at December 31, 1964.

Helicopters

Carriers operating helicopters exclusively logged 93,599 revenue hours in 1965, or 86.9 per cent of the total reported for helicopters, and an increase of 19.2 per cent over the 1964 figure of 78,527 revenue hours. These carriers accounted for 12.0 per cent of the revenue hours of canadian carriers as a whole, with total assets of \$12.6 million or 3.2 per cent of Canadian carriers' total assets.


Accidents

In 1965 there were 348 accidents involving aircraft of Canadian registry. Of these, 143 or 41.1 per cent occurred during commercial operations. Of the total, 260 or 74.7 per cent were attributed to pilot error. The number of accidents increased 30.0 per cent over the previous year, while the number of fatal accidents went up only 0.7 per cent. Of the 48 fatal accidents, 18 or 37.5 per cent occurred in commercial operations.



Freedoms of the air:
