








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
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
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
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
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## 1967

The figures presented in this publication cover the operating and financial data submitted by Canadian carriers and foreign air carriers operating scheduled services between Canada and other countries. Statistics of Canadian airlines include both their domestic and international flights while figures for foreign companies cover their hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only. Passengers and goods in transit through Canada are not included. Because the coverage given to Canadian airlines differs from that given to foreign airlines the statistics shown under similar headings are not directly comparable.

In this report, Canadian air carriers have been divided into five groups based on gross annual flying revenues and the type of service (scheduled or non-scheduled) performed. Definitions of these groups and of other terms used are given on the last two pages of the publication. The number of Canadian carriers which submitted annual reports for 1967 in each group is as follows:

The total number of air carriers reporting varies slightly from year to year, chiefly because of entires, withdrawals and amalgamations of small air carriers. Changes in the number of small firms are of little significance in the total figures for all categories but there can be significant changes within groups and from one group to another depending upon the activities of individual companies. These changes tend to produce distortions in comparisons of specific groups over a period of years.

Because Nordair Ltd. did not operate Class I services during 1967 it is included in Group III for statistical purposes, even though it is comparable in gross revenue to the carriers in Group II.

Since Group V carriers file reports on a quarterly basis only, data on their operations are not available for monthly publication but are shown in a special table in the monthly report for March, June, September and December. This Group V information is not included in totals for all carriers shown in other tables throughout the report. To be consistent with the monthly publication this practice has been continued in the annual report. Although they are by far the largest group in terms of numbers, the Group V carriers are not significant in terms of revenue; their reported operating revenues usually amount to less than 4 per cent of the total operating revenues of all Canadian carriers.

In Table 7 domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are shown separately. All other tables show totals for all areas of service.

Wherever it is practical to do so, figures for services sold on a unit toll basis are subdivided into scheduled operations and non-scheduled operations. However, a complete breakdown is not possible because some air carriers offer both types of service on the same route. In such cases the route is designated scheduled or non-scheduled according to the type of service which predominates.

Financial statistics of Canadian carriers which are shown in Tables 8 to 16 are collected and compiled according to definitions and procedures outlined in a set of manuals entitled "Uniform System of Accounts and Reports for Commercial Air Carriers".

#### Review of 1967 Operations

The major event of 1967 which affected the operations and financial position of the air transport industry in Canada was the World's Fair "Expo 67" in Montreal. The construction of buildings and facilities for the exposition involved substantial movements of goods and furnishings as well as staff and personnel from foreign countries. During the period when the fair was open traffic flows to and from Montreal were exceptionally high. Visiting journalists, performers, dignitaries and tourists travelled from points around the globe to see the fair and other events associated with the celebrations of the centennary of Canadian confederation.

Figures contained in air carrier statistical reports for 1967 reflect the expansion in business over the previous year. In addition to increased activity and a growth in revenues the major airlines experienced rapidly rising costs which resulted in a decline in net income. Carriers in reporting Group III showed increased net income while those in Group IV showed a decline.

Totals for the approximately 115 air carriers in reporting Groups I-IV indicate that although operating revenues increased by 18.2 per cent to \$544.5 million from the year before, operating expenses rose by 20.0 per cent to \$517.3 million. As a result operating income for 1967 fell by 7.5 per cent to \$27.2 million and net income after income taxes was lower by 26.6 per cent at \$10.2 million than in 1966. The six major carriers accounted for this decline in overall industry totals; net income for the six companies in financial Groups I and II fell by more than \$5 million. Results for the thirty one companies reporting in financial Group III showed an increase in net income in 1967 of \$1.9 million while the carriers in Group IV showed a decrease of \$0.4 million from the previous year.

The interest generated in travel to Canada during 1967 can be seen from the fact that Canadian airlines reported an increase of 18.5 per cent in the number of passengers carried on scheduled international flights. Foreign airlines operating scheduled services to Canada experienced an even sharper increase in passenger traffic as totals rose by 69.7 per cent to \$2.6 million. These foreign airlines also showed a gain of 19.9 per cent in the weight of goods carried on scheduled services.

Specialty flying services provided by small carriers increased sharply during the year. Fixedwing aircraft specialty flying increased by 60,000 hours and \$2.5 million in revenues. The largest single item of increase was in flying training which grew by 43,000 hours and \$1 million in revenues.

Helicopter flying activities (charter and specialty) increased by more than 10,000 hours with specialty flying accounting for more than 8,000 of this growth. Carriers operating helicopters exclusively reported a slight increase in operating income but experienced a decline in net income of almost \$150,000. The number of carriers reporting in Group V decreased from 302 carriers in 1966 to 275 carriers reporting in 1967. However, these carriers reported

flying an additional 33,000 hours. Most of their business was in some type of specialty activity but more than 112,000 transportation flying hours were also reported.

At the year end, the total assets reported by Canadian carriers were valued at \$570,882,400. This amount was more than \$120 million greater than at December 31, 1966. Expansion and improvement of services with larger, more modern aircraft and group equipment accounted for a large proportion of this increase.

#### Accidents

The report entitled "Accidents to Canadian Registered Aircraft" published by the Department of Transport contains a list of the number of accidents showing casualities according to the type of aircraft operation. In 1967 there were 472 reported accidents or 50 more than in 1966. In spite of the larger number of accidents there were 154 people killed or 17 fewer than in the previous year. Of these fatalities 68 were in commercial air services and 86 were in non-commercial operations. Commercial operations showed 37 accidents involving fatalities while non-commercial operations accounted for 47.

Bulk transportation	<ul> <li>(1) Public transportation of passengers or goods from a designated base at a tell our mile or per hour for the charter of the entire aircraft (Class 4).</li> <li>(2) Transportation of passengers and goods in accordance with one or more specific</li> </ul>
	contracts (Class 5).
Cargo, Air	Air freight and air express (excluding mail and excess baggage).
Carrier, Air	One authorized to operate aircraft in or over Canada for hire or reward.
Carrier, non-scheduled	Carriers not operating any scheduled (Class 1 or Class 8) service.
Carrier, scheduled	Carriers serving designated points in accordance with a service schedule and at a toll per unit.
Express, Air	A package service operated only within the U.S.A. and Canada; the rates cover door- to-door service. Because Air Express shipments take priority over Air Freight they command higher rates.
Freight, Air	Property carried at published tariff rates per unit of measure or weight.
Goods, revenue	Air cargo (freight and express) plus mail and excess baggage.
Group I carriers	Canadian Air Carriers licensed to perform both domestic and international scheduled services, (Air Canada and Canadian Pacific Air Lines Ltd.).
Group II carriers	Canadian Air Carriers other than Group I carriers licensed to perform domestic scheduled services and Nordair Ltd. (For statistical purposes Nordair is included in Group III).
Group III carriers	Canadian Air Carriers, licensed to perform non-scheduled services, with gross annual flying revenues of \$500,000 or over (excepting air carriers included in Group I and II).
Group IV carriers	Canadian Air Carriers, licensed to perform non-scheduled services, with gross annual flying revenues of \$100,000 and over, but less than \$500,000.
Group V carriers	Canadian Air Carriers, licensed to perform non-scheduled services, with gross annual flying revenues of less than \$100,000.
Interline traffic:	
Divisional interline	Passengers and goods received from other operating divisions of the same carrier.
Domestic interline	Passengers and goods received by a carrier at Canadian points from other Canadian Air Carriers.
Foreign interline	Passengers and goods received by a carrier from Foreign Air Carriers.
International Services:	
Pacific and Orient Services	Services between Canada and points in the Pacific Ocean, Orient and Australasia.
Southern Services	Services between Canada and Bermuda, the Caribbean, Mexico, Central or South America.
Trans-Atlantic and Polar Services	Services between Canada and Europe.
Trans-border Services	Services between Canada and the United States except Hawaii.
Load capacity available	Load capacity available for the transportation of goods and passengers after deduction of the operating load of gas and oil, crew, stewards' supplies, etc.
Miles	Statute miles of 5,280 ft.
Passenger	A person occupying a separate seat on a one-way trip. For statistical purposes an infant-in-arms is not considered a passenger. A round trip passenger is counted as two passengers.
Non-revenue passenger	A person (including company personnel other than crew) carried on a revenue transportation flight for whom no fare is collected.
Revenue passenger	A child or adult for whom a fare or part of a fare is paid.
Passenger load-factor	Ratio of revenue passenger-miles performed to available seat-miles.
Passenger-mile	The transportation of one passenger one mile.
Seat-miles available	Seats available for the transportation of passengers multiplied by the miles flown on each inter-station flight.
Specialty Flying Services	Non-transportation flying services such as flying training, aerial photography, and aerial inspection.
Tons	Short tons of 2,000 lbs.
Ton-miles	The transportation of one ton of goods one mile or any combination of weight in pounds and number of miles flown the product of which is 2,000.
Ton-miles available	Available load capacity multiplied by miles flown on each inter-station flight.
Unit toll transportation	Public transportation of passengers and goods at a toll per unit. It includes:
	(i) scheduled services between designated points in accordance with a schedule (Class I); and
	(ii) non-scheduled services either between designated points on a route pattern and with some degree of regularity (Class 2) or from a designated base to serve a defined area or a specific point or points (Class 3).
Weight load factor	Ratio of revenue ton-miles performed to available ton-miles.



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
