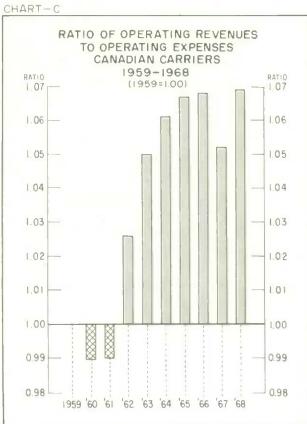




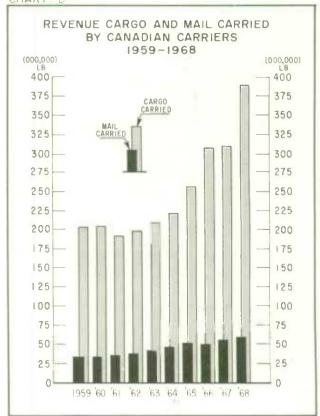












## 1968

The figures presented in this publication cover the operating and financial data submitted by Canadian carriers and foreign air carriers operating scheduled services between Canada and other countries. Statistics of Canadian airlines include both their domestic and international flights while figures for foreign companies cover their hours and miles flown over Canadian territory only. Passengers and goods in transit through Canada are not included. Because the coverage given to Canadian airlines differs from that given to foreign airlines the statistics shown under similar headings are not directly comparable.

In this report, Canadian air carriers have been divided into five groups based on gross annual flying revenues and the type of service (scheduled or non-scheduled) performed. Definitions of these groups and of other terms used are given on the last two pages of the publication. The number of Canadian carriers which submitted annual reports for 1968 in each group is as follows:

The total number of air carriers reporting varies slightly from year to year, chiefly because of entries, withdrawals and amalgamations of small air carriers. Changes in the number of small firms are of little significance in the total figures for all categories but there can be significant changes within groups and from one group to another depending upon the activities of individual companies. These changes tend to produce distortions in comparisons of specific groups over a period of years.

Because Nordair Ltd. did not operate Class I services during 1968 it is included in Group III for statistical purposes, even though it is comparable in gross revenue to the carriers in Group II.

Since Group V carriers file reports on a quarterly basis only, data on their operations are not available for monthly publication but are shown in a special table in the monthly report for March, June, September and December. This Group V information is not included in totals for all carriers shown in other tables throughout the report. To be consistent with the monthly publication this practice has been continued in the annual report. Although they are by far the largest group in terms of numbers, the Group V carriers are not significant in terms of revenue; their reported operating revenues usually amount to less than 4 per cent of the total operating revenues of all Canadian carriers.

In Table 7 domestic and international operations of Canadian carriers are shown separately. All other tables show totals for all areas of service.

Wherever it is practical to do so, figures for services sold on a unit toll basis are subdivided into scheduled operations and non-scheduled operations. However, a complete breakdown is not possible because some air carriers offer both types of service on the same route. In such cases the route is designated scheduled or non-scheduled according to the type of service which predominates.

Financial statistics of Canadian carriers which are shown in Tables 8 to 16 are collected and compiled according to definitions and procedures outlined in a set of manuals entitled "Uniform System of Accounts and Reports for Commercial Air Carriers".

#### Review of 1968 Operations

The number of revenue passengers carried by all services of Canadian air carriers in groups I-IV during 1968 was 9,305,478, an increase of 4.0 per cent over 1967. Foreign airlines carried 2,552,223 revenue passengers for a decrease of 3.6 per cent from 1967. The abnormally high traffic volume generated by Expo 67 has caused a less than normal increase from 1967 to 1968. Revenue passengers carried by unit toll services of Canadian carriers rose 3.3 per cent over the previous year, from 8,157,263 in 1967 to 8,428,972 passengers in 1968.

Miles flown by Canadian and foreign air carriers on scheduled unit toll services rose from 124,847,746 to 139.542,867 miles, for an increase of 11.8 per cent, and hours flown increased 8.8 per cent over 1967 for the same services.

The ratio of operating revenues to operating expenses rose considerably from 1.052 in 1967, to 1.069 in 1968. This increase shows well on chart C, page 4. Net income after taxes rose 17.3 per cent from \$10,201,222 to \$11,970,627. At year end, the total assets reported by Canadian carriers were valued at \$742,243,559, as compared with \$570,882,400 for 1967.

#### Helicopters

Carriers operating helicopters exclusively reported 133,562 revenue hours, an increase of 8.1 per cent over 1967. These operations accounted for 89.7 per cent of the total number of hours flown by all helicopters. Of the total number of revenue hours flown for all types of services, by all types of aircraft, the revenue hours flown by helicopters accounted for 12.9 per cent. Of the total amount of assets reported by all Canadian carriers, helicopter carriers' share was 3.1 per cent.

#### **General Factors**

Services.—From June 16 to July 1, 1968, BOAC was on strike. Only one return flight daily to Britain was operated during this period.

For the months of May and June, Air France had reduced and sporadic service into Montreal.

In September, Japan Air Lines Ltd. initiated scheduled service into Canada, at Vancouver.

Other factors.—A Canadian postal strike took place from July 18 to August 8.

Effective September 1, 1968, all 1st class mail from the United States to Canada was transported by air rather than by surface.
