CAR LOADINGS

No. 40

(Fortieth Week ended October 6th, 1934.)

Car loadings for the week ended October 6th amounted to 53,050 cars, as against 53,198 cars last year and 50,547 cars for the previous week, and the index number rose from 65.72 for the previous week to 65.98.

Grain in the western division increased from 4,773 cars to 7,160 cars, but was still light compared with 1933 and 1932 loadings. Miscellaneous freight increased to 4,112 cars, as against 3,201 cars for the previous week and 3,334 cars last year. Merchandise, ore, other forest products, coal and live stock were all considerably heavier than in 1933 and the total of 23,060 cars was 1,058 cars over last year's total of 22,002 cars.


Total loadings in the eastern division amounted to 29,990 cars as against 31,196 cars for the corresponding week last year. Coal showed a decrease of 1,241 cars, coke was lighter by 341 cars, live stock by 152 cars and pulpwood by 91 cars. Miscellaneous freight was heavier by 312 cars, pulp and paper by 166 cars and lumber by 102 cars; other commodities showed only small differences.


