Car loadings of revenue freight for the holiday week ended by 2nd declined to 62,070 cars compared with 71,064 cars in the same week last year and 68,766 in 1947. As the holiday was followed by a Saturday this year, it is likely that loadings were concentrated in the days Monday to Thursday, as many firms granted employees the advantage of the long weekend.

Reduced loadings from the corresponding week of 1948 were recorded in 22 of the 31 groups with the largest declines in forest products. Pulpwood dropped from 6,353 to 2,419 cars and lumber from 4,063 to 3,412 cars. Coal at 4,157 was down 876 cars. Woodpulp and paper eased from 3,701 to 2,803 cars. Improvement, however, was shown in fresh vegetables and other agricultural products, ores and concentrates, crude oil and gasoline, autos, trucks and parts which advanced from 840 to 1,119 cars and canned foods up 75 cars to 366 cars for the week under review. Eastern division loadings were 40,115 cars against 48,451 cars one year earlier, while the western division totalled 21,955 compared with 22,613.

In the first half of this year loadings totalled 1,875,721 cars against 1,934,305 cars in the 26 weeks of 1948 and 1,890,008 in 1947.

Eastern division reported 1,239,964 cars in the first half of the year, a decline of 5.7 p.c. or 74,901 cars from last year, while the western division, due to grain and oil, improved from 619,440 to 635,757 cars, or by 2.6 p.c.

Receipts from foreign connections at 818,592 cars in the first 26 weeks were down nearly 100,000 cars from the same period of 1948, and represent reductions in intransit American freight and reduced Canadian imports.
