Revenue cars loaded in Canada during the week ended March 18th improved to 74,511 cars against 71,127 cars in the preceding week and 72,991 cars in the 11th week of last year, an advance of 1.8 p.c. or 1,320 cars over 1949. A reading of the chart on the reverse will illustrate the steady climb in Canadian loadings since the storm induced low levels of early January and the current week is the second time that car loadings have broken through the previous year's line.

Eastern division volume was up from 47,563 cars in the 11th week of 1949 to 49,836 cars as grain, coal, lumber, gasoline and oils, autos and woodpulp and paper advanced. Western loadings were 24,475 against 25,428 cars due mainly to the drop of nearly 2,000 cars in grain.

Compared with 1949, the national totals registered gains in grain products, hay and straw, fruit, coal up from 5,101 to 6,303 cars, other mine products, logs, lumber at 4,018 against 5,212 cars one year earlier, gasoline and crude up from 4,165 to 5,578 cars, autos and trucks increasing 460 car loads to 1,628 for the week, woodpulp and paper at 5,091 compared with 4,358 cars, and in other manufactures. Reductions were evident in grain off from 6,986 to 5,444 cars, live stock, building products, pulpwood 1,547 cars lighter at 3,579, iron and steel, and L.C.L. merchandise down from 18,025.to 16,788 cars.

Receipts from foreign connections totalled 33,060 cars during the week under review compared with 29,448 cars in the previous week and 31,251 cars in the 11th period of 1949.

Upon the settlement of the coal strike, United States loadings sourced sharply from 574,395 cars in the 9th week to 707,962 cars in the 10th week and were nearly equal to the corresponding period of 1949. This upswing naturally benefitted receipts from foreign connections, both for delivery to Canadian consumers and intransit across Canadian territory.

Cumulative Canadian loadings for the first eleven weeks were 745,851 cars compared with 797,533 cars in the similar period last year and 806,663 in 1948.
