CAR LOADINGS

(Nineteenth week ended May 13, 1950)

Cars of revenue freight loaded at Canadian points during the week ending May 13th totalled 75,343 cars, up from 73,928 in the preceding week and 1,239 cars or 1.7 p.c. above the 19th period of last year. Volume for the Eastern division climbed from 50,352 to 52,016 cars with appreciation shown in the movement of grain, vegetables, coal, cres, mine products, lumber, gasoline, autos, woodpulp and paper and miscellaneous manufactures. The western sector reported 23,327 cars against 25,752 cars one year earlier. Coal, cres, building products, logs, lumber and fertilizers gained. On the 11th, acute flood conditions in Manitoba forced an embargo to be placed against all live stock destined to the St. Beniface yards.

Canadian totals for the week show grain at 6,218 cars compared with 6,119 in the corresponding period of 1949, surpassing for the first time a similar week of last year. Vegetables rose from 554 to 1,024 cars while live stock loadings were up slightly. Coal increased from 4,699 to 5,114 cars, ores from 3,002 to 4,071, bullion from 522 to 699 cars. Forest products, except pulpwood, continued to move in good volume. Logs totalled 1,058 cars compared with 848 cars one year earlier, lumber climbed 548 cars to 3,946, while woodpulp and paper showed 4,320 cars against 3,706 cars. Gasoline and crude continued heavier with 5,473 cars as compared with 5,163, up 6 p.c. Autos and trucks were 78 heavier at 1,244 for the week. Canned foods rose 105 cars to 419 and miscellaneous rose 501 cars to 6,045.

Lighter loadings were confined mainly to grain products, other agricultural and dairy products, meats, building products, pulpwood off from 2,471 to 1,800 cars, sugar, implements, and L.C.L. freight down from 18,859 to 17,222 cars.

Receipts from foreign connections registered a minor decline at 30,572 cars compared with 30,870 cars in the 19th week of 1949.

The cumulative national total at 1,323,687 cars is down only 53,678 cars or 3.9 p.c. from that for the similar weeks of last year.
