CAR LOADINGS

(Thirtieth week ended July 29, 1950)

Revenue cars of freight loaded across Canada during the week ended July 29th reached a new peak for the period at 81,096 cars, an advance of 7,563 cars or 10.3 p.c. over the corresponding week of 1949 and 434 cars heavier than in the 29th week of this year. Since the middle of May the weekly volume has been well above both 1949 and 1948 levels.

In the week under review 19 of the thirty-two commodity groups registered gains over the same week last year with the declines confined mainly to farm products. However, grain shipments were slightly higher at 7,045 cars against 6,939 one year ago and live stock was up 190 cars at 1,746. Coal shipments at 5,593 cars for the week compare with 5,155 cars, while coke, ores, building products, other mine products increased. Pulpwood shipments were up from 2,962 to 4,200 cars as demand continued heavy for newsprint. Lumber rose from 5.896 to 5,896 cars. Gasoline and crude oil were up 278 cars and 441 cars respectively. Sugar totalled 612 cars against 452 cars one year earlier. Iron and steel climbed from 1,292 to 1,681 cars and autos and trucks jumped spectacularly from 650 to 1,628 carloads. Woodpulp and paper loaded during the week totalled 4,537 cars, up from 3,589. and miscellaneous manufactures advanced 616 carloads to 5,770 cars. L.C.L. shipments were nearly maintained at 17.191 cars. The only sizeable declines were in grain products, hay and straw, fruit, other agricultural products and fertilizers.

Eastern division loadings were 53,215 cars against 47,095 cars in the 30th week of 1949, while western volume rose from 26,438 to 27,881 cars.

Receipts from connections were heavy at 34,057 cars compared with 29,463 cars in the same week last year, but were somewhat affected by the re-routing of some United States traffic over Canadian lines due to a trestle burnt out on the Central Vermont. About 1,500 cars were thus moved.

Cumulative loadings for the 30th week period were 2,185,832 cars compared with 2,169,912 cars in the same week of 1949. Eastern division was up 37,561 cars while the west eased 21,641 cars under 1949, due mainly to lower grain, pulpwood, gasoline and L.C.L. shipments.
