CAR LOADINGS

(Thirty-first week ended August 5, 1950)

No. 31

The heavy loading of railway freight continued in the week ended August 5th when car loadings totalled 77,933 cars, an increase of 8,885 cars or 12.9 p.c. over the corresponding period of last year at 69,048 cars and compare with a revised 81,052 cars in the 30th week of the current year.

Eastern division volume was 50,740 cars against 43,858 in the same week of 1949 while western loadings amounted to 27,193 cars, a gain of 2,003 cars over last year at 25,190 cars. Receipts from foreign connections rose from 29,097 to 34,733 cars in the like comparison.

Advances in domestic loadings over the similar period last year were registered in grain up 228 cars to 5,884, grain products, live stock up from 1,428 to 1,641 cars, dairy products, meats, other animal products, coke, ores and other mine products. Pulpwood rose sharply from 3,203 to 4,313 cars and lumber from 3,700 to 5,891 cars. Gasoline advanced 505 cars to 4,823 while crude oil was up from 1,067 to 1,551 cars. Sugar was 138 cars heavier at 495 cars for the week. Iron and steel and implements also increased. Autos and trucks jumped from 324 to 992 carloads. Woodpulp and paper rose 808 cars over the 3,536 cars loaded in the 31st week of 1949. Canned food and miscellaneous manufactures joined in the advance with the latter up 749 cars to 5,779. L.C.L. merchandise improved from 15,912 to 16,677 cars. Declines were limited to fruit, hay and straw, other forest products and coal which slipped from 4,646 to 4,501 cars.

For the first 31 weeks, a total of 2,263,721 cars were loaded in Canada compared with 2,238,960 cars in the similar period last year, a betterment of 24,761 carloads, which resulted from greater activity on the eastern lines.

Weekly loadings in the United States spurred by the Korean incident have increased spectacularly since the first week in July and are regaining the high level of 1948.
