CAR LOADINGS

Loadings for the 37th week totalled 88,090 cars, up sharply from the Labor Day week of September 9th with 78,023 cars, and show an increase of 2.4 p.c. or 2,051 cars over the 37th period of last year. In the similar period of 1948 a record 90,852 cars of revenue freight were loaded.

Heavier loadings as compared with the same week of 1949 were registered in coke, ores and concentrates up from 3,824 to 4,518 cars, base bullion, building products, other mine products, logs up 257 cars to 1.251, pulpwood at 3,232 cars against 2,631 cars one year earlier and lumber jumping from 3,994 to 6,074 cars. Also sharing in the advance were other forest products, gescline, crude oil, sugar, iron and steel up from 1,783 to 2,160 cars, and autos and trucks at 1,778 car loads compared with 1,277 in the 37th week of 1949. The woodpulp and paper group showed a good gain of 689 car loads to 4,472 for the week as shipments were accelerated to make good deficiencies caused by the 9-day strike. Canned food and the miscellaneous group rose appreciably while L.C.L. volume was nearly maintained at 18,579 car loads against 18,632 one year earlier.

The movement of grain showed a sharp decline from 1949 when the harvest was earlier. Cars numbered only 6,020 against 10,942 in the same week last year and all other agricultural items registered varied decreases in volume. Live stock, however, showed only minor decline from 2,286 to 2,267 cars. Coal slipped from 7,420 to 6,887 cars.

Foreign receipts climbed to 34,840 cars from 30,473 in the preceding week and 30,192 cars last year. Car loadings in the United States have been considerably above 1949 since mid-July and approach 1948 record levels. A shortage of box cars has slowed down Camadian loadings at some points, partly due to the increase of Canadian cars still on United States lines, which rose from 18,780 in mid-September of 1949 to 33,790 cars at the same date this year. Total cars owned by the 8 leading Canadian lines stood at 170,743 compared with 171,521 last September.

The cumulative total for the first 37 weeks was 2,655,726 cars against 2,723,123 cars last year. Previous to the strike the current year totals were running slightly above 1949.
