Carloadings continued in heavy volume during the week ended October 28th to total 92,555 cars, down slightly from the previous week at 92,733 cars, but 4,611 cars or 5.3 above the 43rd period of last year. The total for the week under review is the highest for the like period since 1928 when the grain movement was more than double the current volume. The present rate of loading despite the recent sharp diversion of crude oil to the Interprovincial Pipeline, confirms the high level of economic activity throughout Canada.

Eastern division volume amounted to 58,139 cars during the week of October 28th compared with 53,814 cars one year earlier while western traffic showed a minor gain from 34,130 to 34,416 cars. Crude oil dropped from 1,037 cars in 1949 to 348 cars last week.

The national total advanced through increases over 1949 in grain and grain products up 305 cars, other agricultural products rising from 963 to 1,456 cars, ores and concentrates 1,388 cars heavier at 4,992, and in building products and other mine products. The forestry group registered spectacular improvement with logs up from 1,013 to 1,223 cars, pulpwood at 2,909 against 2,133 cars and lumber up 1,458 cars to 5,602 cars for the week. Other forest products rose 310 cars while woodpulp and paper rose from 4,090 to 4,518 cars. Gasoline and petroleum totalled 4,274 cars against 3,903 in the same week of 1949 but crude oil was only 372 cars, down from 1.044 cars one year ago. Iron and steel moved in 2,021 carloads or 431 more this year. Autos and trucks totalled 1,238 against 1,138 cars. Fertilizers were also heavier while miscellaneous gained 589 cars to 6,250 for the week. Reductions from the similar period of last year were mainly in fresh fruits down from 962 to 736 cars, vegetables off 267 cars to 1,364, live stock at 3,057 against 3,663 cars one year earlier, and fresh meats. Coal totalled 7,557 cars compared with 8,178 but coke was up 99 cars to 754. Crude oil, implements and L.C.L. were lower, the last at 18,496 cars or 504 below 1949.

Receipts from connections advanced to 36,243 cars against 35,296 in the preceding week and 32,119 in the 43rd period of last year.

Despite the 9 day strike this year, the cumulative total of 3,192,814 cars loaded in Canada during the first 43 weeks is only 1.5 p.c. below the same weeks of 1949.
