Revenue cars of freight loaded by the principal railways of Canada during the week ended November 4th amounted to 88,532 cars, up 4,894 cars or 5.9 p.c. above the same week last year and 2,200 cars more than in the 44th week of 1948. The week's aggregate was the third highest on record for the period exceeded only by 1947 and 1928 when grain was moved in much heavier volume.

The western division contributed 32,691 cars to the week's total compared with 32,913 cars last year while eastern loadings advanced from 51,625 to 55,841 cars or by 8.16 p.c.

The seasonal trend of carloadings to the end of the year will be sharply downward but the year's total should be only slightly under 1949, despite the August strike. Commencing in the week of October 21st this year, the railways lost some 700 cars of crude oil weekly to the new western pipeline. However, gasoline and petroleum oils and products have moved by rail in better volume than in 1949 and the net loss has been under 350 cars per week. Cumulative loadings for the first 44 weeks of the current year were 3,281,346 against 3,323,782 cars last year.

Comparisons with the corresponding week of 1949 indicate increases in loadings of grain products, fruits, other agricultural products, ores and concentrates up from 3,319 to 4,588 cars, base bullion, building products and other mine products. The forestry group showed continued high activity with logs at 1,208 cars against 1,082, pulpwood at 2,873 cars compared with 1,810 cars in 1949 and lumber up from 3,506 to 4,888 cars. Other forest products rose 54 cars to 459 for the week while woodpulp and paper totalled 4,485 carloads against 4,014 last year. Gasoline and petroleum oils climbed from 3,671 to 4,565 cars but crude oil dropped from 1,148 to 330 cars due to pipeline diversion.

Iron and steel products totalled 1,818 cars or 283 more than last year and autos and trucks moved up from 882 to 1,193 carloads. Other manufactures and miscellaneous increased 170 cars to 5,877 for the week. Live stock shipments were maintained with 2,679 cars against 2,678 in the 44th period of 1949. Declines were confined mainly to grain off 129 cars, vegetables down from 1,603 to 1,141 cars, fresh meats, coal at 7,407 against 7,683 cars, crude oil, sugar and L.C.L. which eased from 18,623 to 17,902 cars.

Foreign receipts continued at a high level with 36,753 cars against 36,243 in the previous week and 32,739 cars in the 44th period last year. Loadings in the United States have shown wide gains over 1949 since mid-July.
