CAR LOADING

(Fifth week ended February 4, 1950

BIELIOTHÈQUE

Car loadings of revenue freight reported for the week ended February 4th increased to 67,737 cars from 64,053 cars in the previous week but were still 5,051 cars or 6.9 p.c. under the 5th period of last year. Track blockages again delayed movement in British Columbia where snowslides were frequent. Western division loadings were thus 20,105 cars against 24,935 cars one year earlier, while the eastern region from the Head of the Lakes to Newfoundland totalled 47,632, down only fractionally from the 47,853 cars reported for the 5th week of 1949.

Declines in national totals were registered in grain off from 5,156 cars to 3,169 cars, and in fruit, vegetables, ores, building materials, logs down from 1,158 to 643 cars, pulpwood at 4,384 cars compared with 7,004 cars in the same week of last year, and in L.C.L. merchandise which dropped from 17,510 to 15,926 cars.

Increased loadings were reported for grain products, live stock up from 1,248 to 1,392 cars, fuels, base bullion, other mine products, gasoline and petroleum at 4,810 cars against 4,539, sugar, iron and steel, autos and trucks which jumped from 786 to 1,328 cars, and in canned food products. The drop in western division was severe in grain at 1,874 cars compared with 4,214 cars in the corresponding week of 1949, and pulpwood sagged from 1,767 to 1,006 cars and lumber was off from 1,359 to 1,019 cars.

Receipts from foreign connections continued considerably below last year's level due in part to coal strikes in the United States, where total car loadings for the first four weeks of the current year were 15.9 p.c. below the same period of 1949. In the same comparison Canadian loadings were down 13.8 p.c. Receipts from connections to February 4th were 139,215 cars this year as against 158,128 cars in the first 5 weeks of 1949 and 171,250 cars in 1948.
