CAR LOADINGS

(Fifteenth week ended April 14, 1951)

The volume of freight loadings in the week of April 14th continued remarkably steady with the Canada total at 79,737 cars against 79,734 cars in the previous week. However, the advance over the 15th period of last year with 69,072 cars aggregated an impressive 10,665 cars or 15.4 p.c. Easter Monday occurred in the 15th week of 1950. The Eastern division reported 54,199 cars loaded during the week under review, the exact number as in the preceding week but a gain of 8,884 cars over the corresponding period of 1950 as coal, ores, building products, pulpwood, lumber, iron and steel, and autos posted splendid increases in the region. The western division showed 25,538 cars loaded against 25,757 cars one year earlier, up 7.5 p.c. with the grain and forest products movements much more active.

Receipts from foreign connections brought 36,059 cars or 4,257 cars more than in the same week last year for an increase of 15.4 p.c.

The national totals show grain up from 5,664 to 7,295 cars while grain products improved 205 cars over 1950 to 2,727 cars. Fresh meats increased from 571 to 411 cars. Coal shipments totalled 5,525 carloads, a gain of 1,117 cars all in the east. Ores and concentrates rose from 2,579 to 2,901 cars. Construction materials at 4,558 carloads improved by 985 cars. Other mine products were up 520 cars to 1,651. The forestry group continued buoyant with 5,657 cars of pulpwood loaded against 1,270 cars one year ago while lumber shipped totalled 4,175 cars, up 928 cars. Sugar advanced from 170 to 299 cars. Iron and steel demand continued strong with 2,254 carloads moving compared to 1,655 cars in the 15th period last year. Implements improved while autos and trucks shipments sparked by the Budget changes and strong demand, climbed from 1,512 to 2,101 carloads. Woodpulp and paper increased 375 cars to 5,089 for the week. Other manufactures at 6,525 cars compare with 5,069 cars one year earlier, a gain of 1,456 cars or over 28 p.c. L.C.L. marchandise amounted to 18,716 cars or 509 cars above last year.

The tight car situation has shown a little improvement with a reduction from mid-March in Canadian cars on foreign lines but the April 16th report on Freight Car Locations shows the number of cars owned by the reporting railways as 170,064 against 175,159 cars one year earlier. With the volume of loadings considerably above last year, delivaries of new box cars are urgent.

Cumulative loadings to April 14th totalled 1,121,419 cars against 1,027,544 cars in the same period last year (up 9.2 p.c.), and compare with 1,080,969 cars in the first 15 weeks of 1949. Receipts from foreign connections rose from 450,480 cars last year to 545,245 cars in the current cumulative.
