Revenue freight loadings during the 18th week ended May 5th continued at record levels to total 85,200 cars, an increase of 9,508 carloads or 12.6 p.c. over the corresponding period of 1950. In the preceding week of the current year a revised total of 85,882 cars were loaded. Western loadings were up from 23,295 cars last year to 27,841 in the week under review, a betterment of 4,546 cars with grain and grain products, building materials and forestry items featured in the advance. Eastern volume amounted to 55,359 cars or 4,762 cars above the 18th week of 1950. Grain, coal, building products, pulpwood, iron and steel, autos and paper continued to move in much greater volume than last year throughout the eastern area. Receipts from foreign connections during the week were a healthy 55,019 cars, some 9.8 p.c. or 5,126 cars above the corresponding week one year ago.

The commodity totals for the ten provinces show appreciable advances in grain up from 5,212 to 10,068 cars while grain products moved up from 2,570 to 5,021 carloads. (Wheat supplies held in Canada at the end of April totalled 285 million bushels compared with 191 million at the same time last year. Unfortunately, unusually large proportions of current supply are of low-grade, and marketing presents difficulties. Coarse grain holdings were also much higher.) Fruits and meats also moved in better volume. Building products amounted to 5,579 cars against 4,857. Forestry items posted considerable gains in pulpwood advancing 2,163 cars to 5,686 cars as world demand for paper appeared insatiable. Lumber at 3,985 cars rose 529 cars over loadings during the 18th period of 1950. Gaseline and petroleum oils moved up from 5,870 to 4,001 cars. The iron and steel plants contributed 2,255 carloads during the week against 1,902. Implements were also heavier while autos and trucks continued to pour off the assembly lines with 1,800 railway cars loaded compared to 1,124 cars last year. Fertilizers at 1,595 were up 207 carloads. The woodpulp and paper total was 4,853 cars or 524 cars above the similar period of 1950. Miscellaneous items totalled 6,496 cars against 5,652 while L.C.L. freight aggregated 18,113 cars, an increase of 2.5 p.c. or 411.

The principal declines were in hay and straw, vegetables, live stock off from 1,741 to 1,354 cars, coal, ores, bullion, crude oil down from 1,254 to 527 cars and in canned foods.

Minor flooding in some western areas did not seriously interfere with loadings there although brief embargoes were necessary.

Cumulative loadings to May 5th were 1,368,360 cars or 119,918 cars above the same weeks of 1950 while foreign connections supplied an additional 650,681 cars compared with 547,287 cars in the similar period of last year.
