The principal railways reported 88,466 cars of revenue freight loaded during the week ended Saturday last compared with 86,986 cars in the previous week and 90,261 cars in the 58th period of 1950 when livestock, coal, lumber, crude oil and L.C.L. had been loaded in much heavier volume. The decline from last year was thus 1,795 cars or 2 p.c. Despite a larger grain movement, the western division total was off from 52,008 to 50,701 cars, while the east was down slightly at 57,765 or by 488 cars. Receipts from connections last week totalled 34,028 cars against 55,419 cars in the corresponding period of 1950. Data for the Hudson Bay Railway are now included in the Canadian National report.

Grain loadings during the week amounted to an impressive 9,654 cars compared with 7,573 cars in the same week last year while grain products rose 172 cars to 5,148. Building products increased from 5,465 to 5,977 cars. Other mine products improved. Pulpwood shipments continued heavy at 5,467 cars or 2,018 cars above last year. Iron end steel shipments gained 98 cars to 2,259, while implements and machinery were up 125 carloads to 651. The woodpulp and paper group filled 4,574 cars or 157 more.

Declines, however, were general in a wide variety of commodities. Fruits, vegetables, dairy products and meats were lower and livestock declined 685 cars to 1,550. Coal slipped from 7,028 to 6,874 carloads and ores were 430 cars lighter this year at 4,719. Logs and lumber affected somewhat by woods restrictions in British Columbia were reduced with lumber off from 6,222 to 4,778 cars. Crude oil, due to pipelines, filled only 422 tank cars compared with 1,342 last year. Autos and trucks at 1,407 were down 255 carloads. Miscellaneous manufactures required 6,389 cars versus 6,704, while L.C.L. merchandise shipments were reduced to 16,800 cars from 18,484 in the 58th week of 1950.

Cumulative loadings, however, show good gains this year in both the eastern and western divisions with the national total up 279,490 cars or 10.2 p.c. at 5,024,974. Receipts from connections advanced 148,467 cars to 1,513,849 cars in the similar comparison.


