LIERARY

Revenue rail freight loaded across Canada during the week ended September 29th required 87,361 cers compared with a revised 88,535 cars in the preceding week and 90,859 cars during the 39th period of 1950. The decline from the corresponding week last year was thus 3,498 cars or 3.1 p.c., due mainly to reduced shipments of live stock, grain products, lumber, crude oil and L.C.L. merchandise. Eastern division loadings during the week under review were 57,398 cars against 58,482 cars while the western region dropped to 29,963 cars from 32,377 one year earlier. Receipts from commections at 35,314 cars totalled 817 cars less than in the 39th week of 1950.

The grain movement while delayed by snows and wet weather on the Prairies amounted to 9,402 cars compared with 8,525 cars; meats, other agricultural products and packing house products gained. Coal moved up from 7,081 to 7,671 carloads. Building products with contracts at record levels took 5,669 cars, up 192. Pulpwood shipments continued much heavier at 4.728 cars or 1.440 cars above the same week of 1950. Iron and steel manufactures at 2.248 cars increased by 158 cars. Implements were again moved in greater volume at 592 cars against 529. Woodpulp and paper advenced by 157 carloads to 4,818.

The principal recessions were shown in grain products off 528 cars to 2,669, most agricultural items, and in live stock 422 cars lighter at 1,775. Ores slipped 443 cars to 4,325. Logs were down to 965 cars from 1,215 and lumber to 4,853 from 6,092 with the drop in the latter principally in the east. Gasoline was lower while crude oil shrank to 442 cars from 1,504 cars in the pre-pipeline period. Autos and trucks were off 109 carloads to 1,378. L.C.L. merchandise shipments required 16,895 cars or'1,759 under last year when the work week was six days.

Cumulative totals are well above the same period of 1950 and 1949, the national total at 3,112,404 cars being 276,061 cars above the corresponding week of last year and 213,674 cars above 1949.
