

CAR LOADINGS

STATISTICS A 9 19 1987 LIMITARY BIELIOTHEQUE

(Fortieth period ended October 31 1952)

For the closing 10 days of October Canadian railways reported the loading of 139,418 cars of revenue freight or a daily average of 13,942 cars compared with 12,608 cars in the preceding week. This is the most active period in the current year and approaches the record for any similar span. Receipts from foreign connections were also heavy at 50,869 cars or a daily average of 5,087 cars against 4,987 cars in the previous period. Loadings in the eastern division to the Head of the Lakes totalled an impressive 87,812 cars while the western region was considerably stronger with 51,606 cars.

Available comparisons with the last ten days of October, 1951 show good gains in the movement of grain products, fresh fruit, vegetables, other agricultural products, fresh meats, ores, gasoline and petroleum products, other mine products, logs, lumber, automobiles, fertilizers and L.C.L. freight. The principal decreases occurred in livestock, coal, coks, building products, pulpwood, iron and steel items and in woodpulp and paper. Canned foods and miscellaneous manufactures were also below last year's high level.

Cumulative totals for the first ten months of the current year indicate only a minor decline from the peaks reached in 1951. Total cars loaded to October 31st this year amounted to 3,483,884, only 18,281 cars under the same period of last year and well above the 3,221,522 cars reported for the first 10 months of 1950. Foreign connections supplied 1,485,716 cars in the same comparison despits the steel-iron ore strike in the United States and this total is but 1.2 p.c. under the 1,503,898 cars of 1951 and 9.6 p.c. above the 1,355,945 cars received to the and of October in 1950.

The wastern division reported 1,219,236 cars loaded this season against 1,149,067 last year - a new record while eastern loadings declined from 2,353,098 to 2,264,648 cars due mainly to reduced pulpwood, lumber and coal shipments. Foreign receipts were also lower in the east and higher into the west this year, reflecting the encouraging expansion under way in this wast and promising area.
